Canada to Exhibit Agricultural and Mineral Products

Plans for the Canadian building at the Panama-Pacific International exposition at San Francisco in 1915 have been approved and actual work on the big structure is about to be started.

The Canadian Palace, as it is officially named, will be one of the largest and most imposing of the foreign buildings, having a length of 300 feet, a width of 200 feet and a height of 50 feet, and will cost in the neighborhood of \$300,000. It will be the largest building ever erected by Canada at an international exposition, covering 60,000 square feet, and will house one of the most elaborate and comprehensive exhibits of the Dominion's resources and products ever shown on foreign soil. Six hundred thousand dollars has already been voted by the Canadian Parliament for the building and exhibition, but a further grant, bringing the appropriation up to \$1,000,000, will be recommended by the government during the present session of the national legislature.

Canada at the Panama-Pacific exposition is following the policy that has obtained at former expositions, namely, the display of specimens of exhibits of the natural products of the country. Agriculture, horticulture, minerals, forest and fisheries, for the purpose of showing its climatic advantages and its resources to the great number of people who will visit the exposition. Attention will be devoted to transportation facilities, and the rail-roads in the building.

Nurses Will Hold a Conclave at Frisco

Dr. Helen Parker Criswell, president of the International Association of Nurses, has announced that nurses from all parts of the world will hold a world's congress on the grounds of the Panama-Pacific International exposition in San Francisco in June, to which there will be 6,000 accredited delegates. The conclave will include four great congresses: The International Association of Nurses, representing fifteen foreign nations, including England, Ireland, Germany, France, Belgium, Italy, Australia, China, Cuba and others; the American Nurses' association with 22,000 members; the National League of Nurse Education with 12,000 members, chiefly teachers and superintendents of training institutions, and the Organization of Public Health Nurses. The California State Nurses' association will act as hostess to the visitors.

"The attendance from European countries will be enormous," said Dr. Criswell, recently. "These organizations are uniting in preparation of a comprehensive exhibit of all modern hospital appliances, besides a historical exhibit and demonstration wards. The exhibits, including a demonstration hospital, will continue the ten months of the exposition."

BIG CONVENTIONS TO BE HELD DURING EXPOSITION

An international congress on viticulture will be held in San Francisco in June, 1915. Delegates from more than twenty-five nations interested in grape culture will attend the congress. This will be one of the largest congresses held during the exposition.

The International Council of Nurses will meet in San Francisco during the week beginning May 31, 1915. Besides the International Council of Nurses there will be meetings during the week of three national nurses' conventions and of the California Nurses' association. Five thousand nurses from fifteen nations will attend the five meetings.

ITALY WILL SPEND BIG SUM FOR ITS EXHIBIT

Italy has appropriated 2,000,000 lire for an exhibit at the Panama-Pacific International exposition and Signor Ernest Nathan, former mayor of the city of Rome, has been appointed commissioner to the exposition. Prince Scialoja of the Italian ministry officially advised Exposition Commissioner Ira Nelson Morris on February 24 that the decision of Italy to participate was final.

Ask Aviation Men to Meet in Frisco

At the suggestion of the Aero Club of America a special meeting of the great international aviation organization, the Federation Internationale Aeronautique, with headquarters in Brussels, will be called this year to consider the Panama-Pacific International aviation race around the world and the transatlantic flights now being programed.

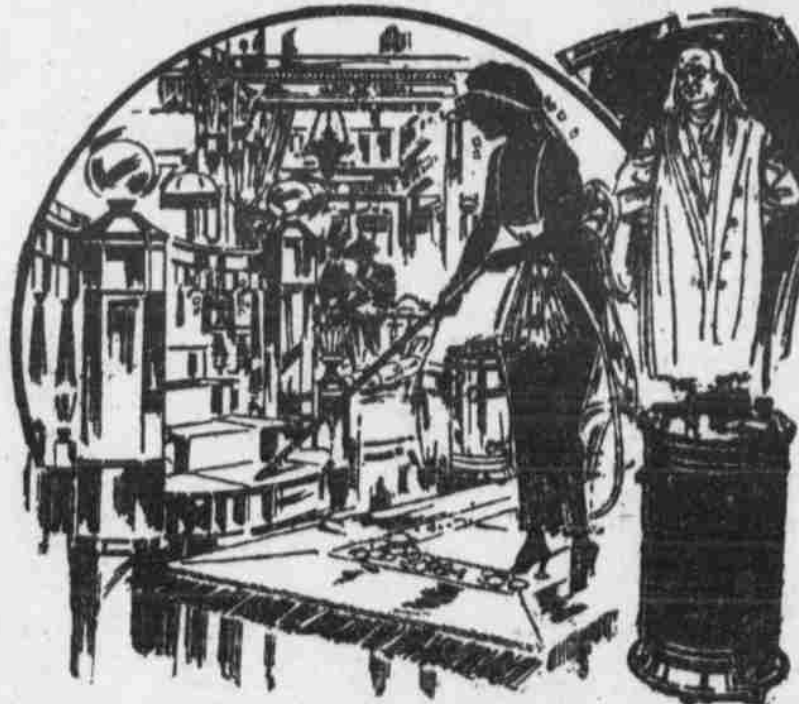
In view of the fact that the most important of these flights will all start from this side of the Atlantic and that the big globe-girdling air race will start and finish on the grounds of the Panama-Pacific International exposition in San Francisco, it is expected that the meeting of this world-wide federation of air men will be held in the United States, either at New York, or more probably, at San Francisco next fall. The federation consists of representatives of France, Germany, Russia, England, Austria, Italy, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Spain, Egypt, Netherlands and the United States.

Prince Roland Bonaparte is at the head of the federation, which is composed in Europe largely of titled nobility and scientific men of international prominence. The organization holds one regular meeting each year and, in addition, a special meeting to consider special events. Special meetings are held in the various countries, represented in the federation, in rotation, and as each of the European countries have had such meetings it is confidently hoped that the meeting this year will take place in the United States. In view of great long distance flights recently made, aviators affirm that the round-the-world flight is made possible through the equipment of adequate supply stations along the proposed route.

Notes of the Exposition. The Argentine Republic has appropriated \$1,000,000 (gold) for its participation in the Panama-Pacific exposition. It is promised that the display of its agriculture, live stock and industrial and social progress will be unsurpassed by any of the nations of the world, not even by the United States.

Since Lincoln Beachey started indoor aviation by his sensational flight in the gigantic palace of machinery, it has become a common sport at the Panama-Pacific International exposition. Beachey has not repeated the flight, but others have successfully attempted to break his record for an indoor endurance flight.

A man whereby the United States, Great Britain and France will patrol the Atlantic ocean with scout cruisers carrying supplies of gas, oil and equipment, is being developed in connection with the Panama-Pacific International round-the-world aviation contest. The cruisers will follow the route across the Atlantic and Pacific oceans, the United States patrolling and marking the course from Bella Island to Cape Fairweather, France, from Cape Fairweather to Reykjavik, Iceland, and Great Britain from Iceland to the Hebrides. Each cruiser will carry one passenger, and will be permitted to land on the cruiser or, in the case of hydroplanes upon the water near the vessels to take on supplies when necessary.
