

### WINTER WHEAT IS UP TO PAR

Burlington's Crop Report Gives the Conditions in the State.  
**PASTURE IN SPLENDID SHAPE**  
All Fruit Except Peaches Give Indications of a Good Crop—Spring Grain is Now Being Sown.

The moisture, adding that the rains this spring have been reasonable, well distributed and fairly heavy in most of the territory.

Spring grain is being sown and the acreage will be about the same as last year. In many localities potatoes have been planted. Meadows and pastures are beginning to show green, indicating that the grass was not seriously injured by the dry weather of last summer.

With the exception of peaches, the report asserts that the prospects for a fruit crop are excellent. Up to this time the weather has not been warm enough to start the buds and consequently there has been no damage by freezing.

The Burlington's regular weekly soil and crop report has been given out, covering conditions in Nebraska for the week ending last Saturday. In dealing with the winter wheat situation it places the conditions as follows:

### INDIAN BIDS GO TO CHICAGO

Omaha Firms, However, Have Still a Chance to Bid.  
**SUPPLIES DELIVERED IN OMAHA**  
Blanks Are Now Ready for Distribution at Indian Warehouse or at the Commercial Club.

Some of the newer firms that have located factories and wholesale establishments in Omaha within the last year have been under the impression that Omaha concerns have no chance in bidding on the contract to furnish supplies for the Indian warehouses because the bids are to be opened in Chicago. It is announced from the Indian warehouse in Omaha that this is a mistake, and that although the bids are to be opened in Chicago this year one firm has as good

chance as another, and the place of opening the bids makes no difference. The custom is to change the place of opening the bids from year to year. Bids to be opened at Omaha some years. While the bids go to Chicago this year the goods to supply the Omaha warehouses must be delivered in Omaha, as the local concerns will at least have the advantage of proximity in figuring their bids. The commodities to be furnished include almost everything that goes to make up the necessities of life. Canned goods, groceries of various kinds, farm implements, school supplies and a great and almost endless variety of items are mentioned in the list. The local warehouse takes somewhere between \$275,000 and \$300,000 worth of supplies annually. Blanks for making bids are furnished by the government. They are kept at the local warehouse, Eleventh and Capitol avenue, and some have been placed in the offices of the Commercial club for distribution to those interested.
