GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Prospects Around Wheat Market Are Quite Bearish.

NO CASH BUSINESS GOING ON New Crop as Well as the Old, Is Sluggish and Russia Reports More Grain Than Can Re Taken Care Of.

OMAHA, April 20, 1914.

Prospects surrounding the wheat market are more bearish than they have been at any time since the grain was seeded last fall. The market is in no position to withstand any increase in the offerings unless prices give way. Those sections of the great belt that were reported as needing moisture were bountifully supplied Friday night and yesterday, and those who have been talking of crop losses because of drouthy conditions will be obliged to find some other cause for builling wheat. Not only were the rains heavy in the winter wheat belt, but they were also reported as free in the spring wheat country, where the seeding will now be pushed to completion. One of the best grain men in the spring wheat country says never in his recollection has the grain gone into the ground under as favorable conditions as this year.

The seeding of oats is progressing raphere is no business in cash wheat to speak of, and this includes the new crop, as well as the old. Russia has a great deal more wheat than can be taken care of there, and in addition to the large offerings by that country, the Danube has more wheat than the more ardent bears dared to hope for. This grain will all come out in due time, and it is probable it will be sold at a price the United States wheat will not reach.

There are some complaints coming from the manipulation of May wheat at Chicago, but still the swings upward and downward continue. The trade in May, however, has narrowed down to small proportions, because of the fact that commission houses are advising their customers to trade in the more deferred futures and not in the May at all. The bears seem to have full control of the corn market, as speculation has always been known to be more uncertain there, there is a possibility of something turning up to partially change the situation.
