Will Make Effort to Collect on Old Police Court Bonds

Persons who have signed bonds of offenders convicted in police court who appeal to district court and fail to appear, are likely to experience increased difficulty in swading liability as the result of a method adopted by Judge Engle.

In all cases where it appears the bonds are of value, and especially in frequent instances when one bondsman has "gone to the front" for a dozen to twenty offenders, the judge is setting dates for trial rather than forfeiting bonds at once.
