CONFERENCE STARTS TODAY

Nebraska Charities Will Hold Three Days' Meeting in Omaha.

TO TALK OVER SITUATION

Methods of Handling Crime and Poverty in Cities Will Be Brought Up for Analysis and Remedies Suggested.

It will be nothing less than a high class school of sociology conducted for three days in Omaha beginning Sunday and lasting until Tuesday evening when the Nebraska Conference of Charities and Correction is held here.

This is to be a body of delegates that represent the heads of institutions and organizations of the state that make a business of charitable and corrective work.

The practical and the theoretical propensities for the handling of crime and poverty are to be thoroughly gone over by those who have seen. Thus a round table of sheriffs, wardens and county commissioners is to be held Tuesday morning. It is to be conducted by James Fenton, warden of the state penitentiary.

"The Co-ordination of Public and Private Agencies for the Prevention of Dependence" is the subject of a paper by Miss Mabel W. Porter, secretary of the Associated Charities of Omaha.

"Municipal Problems" is to be the subject of a paper by W. J. Springhorn of Cleveland. The discussion on this subject is to be led by W. F. Baxter of Omaha.

Dr. Katherine Bennett Davis of New York City is to have a paper on the "Bedford Reformatory." Other speakers of national reputation in work of charity and correction are to address the conference.

The meeting Sunday afternoon is to be in the nature of a mass meeting in the high school auditorium. The opening addresses by the governor and mayor as well as addresses of welcome and statements of purpose are to be made at this time. This will clear the decks for the actual business sessions of Monday and Tuesday.
