

VILLA WANTS CARTRIDGES

Says if He Had Ammunition He Would March to Mexico City. DEFENDS THE CARRANZA NOTE

EL PASO, Tex., April 25.—The international political situation cleared greatly today as affecting the status of the rebel government and that of the United States.

Francisco Villa, who arrived at Juarez yesterday, repeated his declaration that he would not be drawn into a war with the United States, particularly as that would serve to draw the Huerta chestnuts out of the fire.

Rebel Note Misunderstood. Villa said that Carranza's note had been misunderstood and that the first chief was as friendly as was to the United States.

Would Like Aid. Villa frankly took the position that he would like to avail himself of what he, in effect, said from the United States forces to prosecute his campaign.

Not Only Federal Overture. Pequeira is authority for the statement that the federal commander at Guaymas, General Telles, who offered to join with the rebel in that district against the United States, is not the only federal who has made similar overtures and been contemptuously rebuffed.

Hears Monterey Taken. Official notification that the rebels had taken Monterey was received by Villa tonight. "Esta Bien" (It is good) he remarked and dictated a telegram of congratulations to General Pablo Gonzalez, commander of the constitutionalists forces in the region of Monterey.

Wire Run into His House. A telegraph wire was run into his house today and he is in immediate communication with his forces at Torreon and south of that city.

HEAVY LOSSES OF MEXICANS

Hundred and Twenty-Six Dead and 195 Wounded. WASHINGTON, April 25.—One hundred and twenty-six Mexicans have been killed and 195 wounded in the fighting at Vera Cruz since the American forces landed there Tuesday.

Refugees on Board Steamer. There are now about 200 American refugees on board three Hawaiian steamers anchored off breakwater. They have not sufficient food to take refugees to the nearest American port.

Combined Reb and Fed Forces in Two States 21,000 Men. MORE U. S. TROOPS EXPECTED

NOGALES, Ariz., April 25.—Although the rebel General Oregon, following instructions from General Carranza, contemptuously refused the proposition of the federal commander at Guaymas, General P. E. Telles, to join forces to repel a foreign invasion, according to the text of notes exchanged by them and made public tonight, the incident served to arouse Americans as to just what forces could be raised against the United States in this section.
