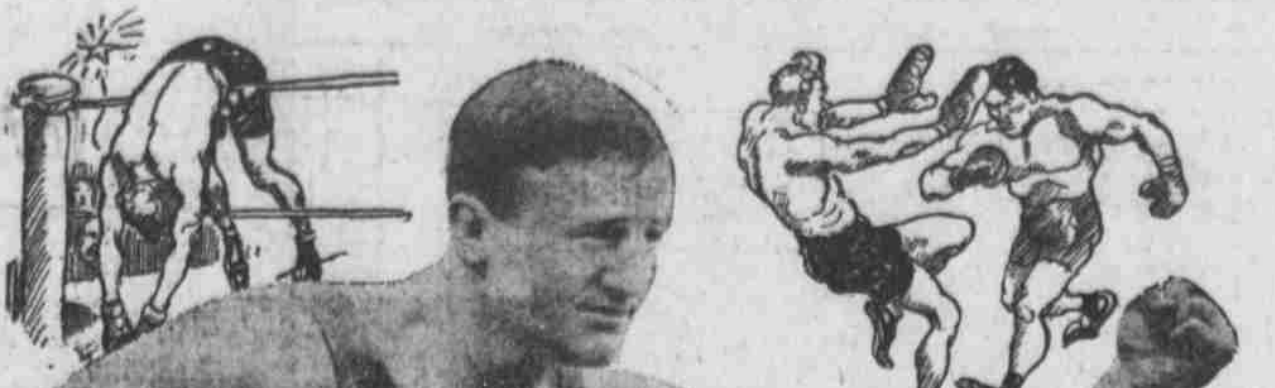
Interest Centering Around College Men Preparing for Races.
