concerned Monday was one of the big days in the history of the Omaha Grain Monday Chicago awooped down upon the Omaha grain market and bought up 500 000 bushels of wheat for delivery this month, the prices ranging around 8614987 cents. It was grain hought early in the season and at prices onsiderably lower, thus enabling the Omaha men to clean up a nice profit. The grain bought by the Chicago mer is to fill orders and has already begun

to load out. Here it is in storage. While the Omaha grain receipts are light at this time, owing to farmers being busy in their fields and not taking time to haul away their grain, they are fully up to the other markets, being thirty-nine cars of wheat, sixty of corn and twenty-four of oats Monday.

Chicago, that gathers its supply of price being 8514 6565% cents.


