Sixty Cases Asking Separation on Docket at Des Moines.

COMES CLOSE TO THE RECORD

DENY BECKER VENUE CHANGE

Second Trial of Police Lieutenant Proceeds in New York.

COCKRAN ATTACKS WHITMAN

Attorney for Defendant Says Prosecutor Talked Too Much and Asks He Be Punished for Contempt.

NEW YORK, May 6.—Indications that District Attorney Whitman intends to go fully into the graft phase of the Charles Becker case were evident today when the former police lieutenant was placed on trial for the second time for the murder of the gambler, Herman Rosenthal. Four men, the sumner, so-called, have already been electrocuted for the crime.

Among the names of prospective witnesses for the state, as called out by the clerk at the opening of the trial, were Rhinelander Waldo, former commissioner of the police; Winfield Shield, his secretary; all the heads of the department as constituted at present; the wife of "Lefty Louie" Rosenberg, the dead gambler; and an assortment of gamblers and characters in the tenderloin.

Change of Venue Denied. Shortly after Becker was brought in his counsel, Bourke Cockran, attacked District Attorney Whitman in a motion asking that he be punished for contempt for "having made statements tending to prejudice the public" against Becker. The motion was denied for the time being, but the court agreed to hear arguments on it later.

In this motion the defendant's attorney again assailed Mr. Whitman for "talking about the case for the benefit of the newspapers," attacking particularly statements attributed to the district attorney concerning perjury committed in the eleventh hour attempt to save the condemned gunman.

One Juror Accepted. Thirteen talemans were called and eliminated and one juror accepted by both sides. He is F. Meredith Blagden, a bond broker and for two years a student at the Harvard law school.

LIPPET RESOLUTION TABLED

Senate Will Not Consider Question About Relations with Villa.

STONE DEFENDS WILSON'S ACTS

Head of Foreign Affairs Committee Says Few Wish to Interfere with the Rebel War on Huerta.

WASHINGTON, May 6.—Vigorous criticism of the administration's Mexican policy and a heated debate over the Vera Cruz situation marked the effort of Senator Lippitt of Rhode Island today to secure action in the senate on his resolution asking President Wilson if he is supporting Pancho Villa for next ruler of Mexico.

The resolution was laid on the table without a record vote. "The suspicion that our government is aiding, abetting or even condoning the villainous Villa is so sickening that I have long refused to believe it," said Senator Lippitt, "but the reports that the president is supporting Villa have continued so long that I have introduced my resolution."

After quoting President Wilson's declarations in his message to congress about observing strict neutrality between the factions of Mexico, Senator Lippitt said the government's actions were much in contradiction to those expressions.

Stone and Lippitt Tilt. Senator Lippitt spoke of the Vera Cruz incident and the loss of Mexican lives as showing the length to which the administration had gone to keep munitions of war to getting into Huerta's hands.

"Oh, I know what the senator meant," continued Senator Stone. "He meant to charge the president with the death of 200 innocent Mexicans—think of it—innocent Mexicans at Vera Cruz."

"The Rhode Island senator seems to regard the Mexican snipers who were firing on our boys in violation of all the rules of warfare, as innocent Mexicans. Why, all the country approves of what the president did at Vera Cruz with the possible exception of the senator from Rhode Island."

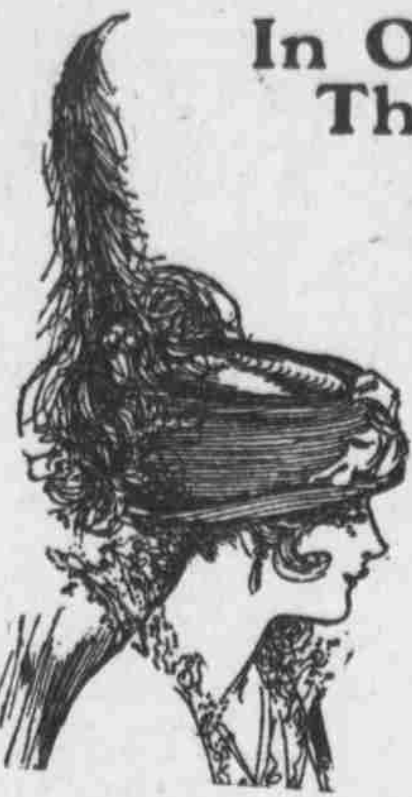
"I neither condone Villa's acts nor do I agree with the Rhode Island senator, who seems to approve the acts of Huerta, a man guilty of treason and whose hands are red with the blood of his chieftain."

Calls Resolution Silly. Senator Stone insisted the resolution was "silly" and moved to table it.

"If Carranza and Villa care to prosecute the war they have declared on Huerta," said Senator Stone. "I don't believe it is the intention of the administration or of this congress and with few exceptions of the people of the United States, to force war on them."

Consul Bonney is Safe. WASHINGTON, May 6.—The Brazilian minister in Mexico City informed the State department today that American Consul Bonney reported under arrest in San Luis Potosi had arrived in Mexico City with Mr. Bonney. Both were safe and well.

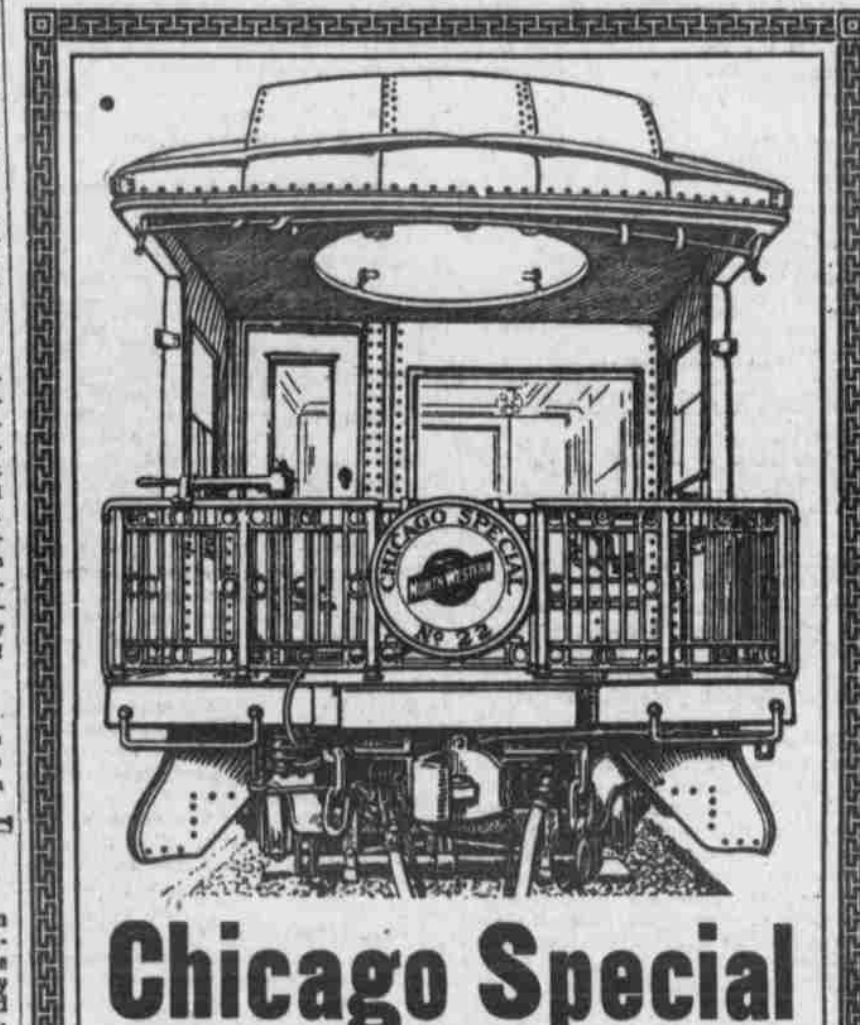
