WEAR A FLOWER FOR MOTHER Mothers' Day Will Be Celebrated in

Omaha Sunday. Y. M. C. A. URGES ALL TO WRITE

Will Provide Stationery and Pens and Ink and Tables in Lobby of the Building for All "Wandering Boys"

"Wear a white carnation Sunday and write home to mother."

That is the word being passed out by all churches, Sunday schools, the Young Men's Christian association and other religious organizations, in preparation for Mothers' day, which will be observed Sunday, both in Omaha and throughout

Out of respect to mothers, thousands of carnations will be worn by men. Men away from home, especially young men and "wandering boys," will be urged to get in touch with home and mother again

by writing a letter. A dozen writing tables, with plenty of free stationery, ink and pens, will be provided in the lobby of the Young Men's Christian association building all day Sunday, to give every young man away from home an opportunity to write to his mother. Special attention will be called on Mothers' day to the framed picture, "Write to Mother," which has hung over the writing tables in the lobby for several years.

To Write to Mother. Secretary J. W. Miller, in charge of the association's plans for the day, expects that over 300 letters will be written home by young men who will make use of the free tables at the association building. White carnations will be on sale there, and at many other places for the convenience of men who will observe the

Mrs. Mary E. Stillwell of Chicago, a brigadier in the Salvation army, who has the distinction of baving reared five sons who are now engaged in Christian work, will be the speaker at a big special Mothers' day meeting for men at the Young Men's Christian association at 4 o'clock Sunday afternoon. A musical program will be furnished by members of the Salvation army. Free admission tickets for the meeting are being distributed through hotels, mills, factories, churches and other places where men can be reached.

Brigadier Stillwell, who is familiarly known to many Salvation workers as 'Mother" Stillwell, will take "Mother" as her subject. In regard to Mothers' day, she said upon arriving from Chicago: Parents to Blame.

Parents are largely to blame for 'wandering boys,' the social evil and vice conditions in general. If fathers and mothers would all find time to be companionable with their children and give them the teaching and training in the home that every child should have, there wouldn't be any wandering boys, and the troubles they meet out in the world would disappear."

She will also speak at the First Methodist church, Twentieth and Davenport streets, Sunday morning at 11 o'clock, on "Rescue and Slum Work."

J. B. Smalley of the Rock Island Dies from Overwork

Word has been received at the office of the Rock Island here, announcing the death of J. B. Smalley, assistant general marrager of the company lines west of the Missouri river, at his home in Topeka, Kan., at 4:30 Friday morning. Death according to the telegram was due to hemorrhage of the brain, caused by over work,

Mr. Smalley was well known in Omaha, the Nebraska lines of the Rock Island having been under his jurisdicton. He was about 53 years of age and had been with the company years, formerly having been superintendent of the Illinois

Mr. Smalley immediately went to the front and took charge of the reconstruction work, where for four days and four nights, he labored without rest, or sleep. At the end of the time, he broke down completely and was hurried home on a special train. He became unconsious and lived but a couple of days.
