PLAN TO OUST FITCH FAILS

Hanscom Park Club Would Substitute Howell in Federated Clubs.

FIRST VOTE TO REMOVE A TIE

Assention is made that Fitch is the Whole Thing in Federation of Improvement Clubs—They Want R. B. Howell.

First guns were fired Thursday night in a campaign to oust F. W. Fitch from the presidency of the Federation of Improvement clubs, which he reorganized, and Institute R. B. Howell as the head of the federation. The first attempt failed, a vote of the delegates standing ten to ten for the ousting of Fitch.

The move against Fitch was planned by the Hanscom Park Improvement club several weeks ago. Howell is a member of this club. The delegates from the Hanscom Park club said Fitch was the "whole thing" at the federation meetings and that other men had little or nothing to say about what should be done.

Hanscom Park Improvement club is the largest in the city.

Fitch, it was understood, would gracefully retire if he was shown that a majority of the delegates were against him, but when Howell was mentioned as his successor his wrath flamed up and he declared he would stand by his guns.

Take Chances.

"You take your chances on the delegates you get here if you elect Howell," said Fitch.

A quiet campaign among all the improvement clubs of the city has been made by the Hanscom Park club in the interests of their campaign to oust Fitch. Unless Fitch is defeated, members of the Hanscom Park club will withdraw their delegations from the federation, they say. The federation is now managed, they declare, does not represent the improvement clubs of the city.

A quarrel followed the reading of the minutes at the meeting Thursday night. Fitch wanted the minutes approved as read, but there was a question as to whether they were correct in that Police Commissioner A. C. Kugel had been endorsed and his opponents censured. Fitch said: "We ought not to censure members of the city council."
