FIRST VICTORY FOR BRENNER

New Bourke Pitcher Keeps Jobbers' Hits Well Scattered. CONGALTON'S HOMER IN TIME With Two Down and One On, Right Fielder Covers Four Bags and Scores Runs Needed for the Lead.

WICHITA, Kan., Aug. 20.—(Special Telegram)—Omaha captured the first game of the series by bunting hits on Riley, Wichita's new pitcher, secured from the Kansas State league. The final count was 5 to 2.

Brenner pitched his first victory for Omaha, keeping the nine hits well scattered. Only one of Omaha's six errors counted in the scoring. Congalton's home run in the eighth inning with one on and the score 3 to 2 against Omaha turned the trick.

Payne led off with a single to right in the first inning. Justice forced Payne at second. Thomson was out at first but Congalton singled to right, scoring Justice. Kane beat out a hit to second and Johnson doubled, scoring Congalton. Grubb was robbed of a hit and thrown out at first by Rapp. Riley settled down and not a runner reached second base until the eighth inning. With two down in the eighth, Thomson singled and Congalton inserted his home run.

In the ninth Schipke tripled and scored when Rapp booted Brenner's grounder. Hughes doubled and Smith's single scored Wichita's run in the second. A single, sacrifice and Hughes' single scored another in the sixth. Burke walked in the seventh and scored when Johnson threw Smith's sacrifice over first. Rapp singled to center but Justice squeezed Nicholson's fly to short left.

The Jobbers threatened in the ninth. Bills batted for Smith and singled to right. Waco hit toward second for an easy double play, but the ball took a freak bound and hit Schipke on the shoulder, both runners being safe. Koerner, who had pitched for Omaha, struck him out to sacrifice and Brenner struck him out.

Bills was caught off second by Johnson and chased between the bags until Justice dropped a throw. Justice redeemed himself by scooping up Rapp's hot grounder and shooting it to Schipke, who completed a double play to Kane.
