

## Disconnected While Talking

Perhaps the most aggravating of all telephone operating errors, from a subscriber's standpoint, is what is termed the cutoff-the taking down of the connection while two persons are talking.

On a modern multiple telephone switchboard more than a hundred lines terminate at each operator's position, and cords, with "plugs" on either end, are used to connect the incoming lines with the outgoing ones.

#### The Reason

A dozen cords are often in use at each operator's position at once, and when calls are flashing in and others have "hung up," in her hurry to connect the calling subscriber, the op-"plug." That causes the cut-off. erator removes the wrong

The cut-off always means extra work for the operator and irritation to the subscriber, and constant supervision and care is exercised to prevent it.
