

SCHLITZER DEFEATS SIOUX

Fa's New Pitcher Makes Ball Out Up Queer Antics.

INDIANS FAIL TO FIND SPHERE

Roorkes Defeat Sioux City by Score of Five to Two, Making Clean Sweep of the Series.

Victor Schlitzer, erstwhile twirler for Connie Mack's Athletics, held the Sioux Indians to two hits in the final game of the series yesterday afternoon. Omaha made eight hits off Doyle and took the game by a 5 to 2 score, making a clean sweep of the series.

From the press box it appeared as if the Roorkes hurler had nothing whatever, but a windup. He worked like a machine. Delivered slowly the ball barely floated across the plate.
