PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 5.—Boston's victory over Philadelphia here today by the score of 6 to 3 was the third straight for the former in the series. The visitors overcame the lead which Philadelphia secured in the fifth inning through hitting Ray Collins' delivery hard in the seventh inning, when three runs were produced on singles by Yerkes and Carrigan, Wagner's double, Behg's sacrifice fly and an error by Plank.
