Standard May Pipe Oil to Omaha from Its Wyoming Field

Word reaches the headquarters of the Northwestern that in the Salt creek oil fields out from Casper, Wyo., forty flowing oil wells have been drilled and cased, owing to the companies being unable to handle the output on account of the immense quantity.

Within the last few days the Standard Oil drilling outfit from Moorcroft have been brought over to the Salt creek country and are now at work there.

Casper is growing rapidly, and at this time there is a move on foot for the construction of a pipe line from the city to some Missouri river point, Omaha being the eastern terminus.

The Standard Oil company is said to be backing the proposed pipe line, and the distance has nothing to do with the possibility of construction. The people who are apparently behind the activities at Casper point to the fact that a pipe line is now in operation between the Oklahoma and Kansas oil fields and the Atlantic seaboard, and oil is handled through it at a very low cost.

They contend that if this pipe line pays a profit on operation, one from Casper to the Missouri river would be a great money maker.
