Captain H. Hollister Kline, manager of the Omaha Salvation Army Industrial home, and his foreman were standing on the long freight receiving platform of the newly finished Salvation Army Industrial home, located in the old Model Laundry building at 1110-1112 East Dodge street when a wagon heavily laden with household furniture in charge of two men drove up and proceeded to deposit its burden. The latter consisted of an iron bed, mattress, springs, a dining room table, some chairs and a cook stove. No sooner had the load been deposited than the wagon hastened to make way for another which brought a huge load of old waste paper, together with several large bundles of magazines. Instantly a number of men in response to a call by the foreman began unloading this wagon and conveying the contents to the large storeroom reserved for this purpose, the waste paper to remain there until dropped through specially arranged chutes to the baling machine in the basement, while the magazines were carefully assorted and put away until needed by the prisons and hospitals. The whole transaction, occupying a few minutes, was conducted in a systematic and efficient manner which bespoke the military training and marked organizing ability of the chief.

Berlin to Establish Municipal Dairy for Deliveries to Poor

BERLIN, Sept. 20.—The Berlin municipal dairy, in addition to its many other lines of business and social activity, has decided to go into the milk business and beginning October 1 it will undertake to supply the poor of a part of Berlin with milk from its own farms.

The municipality has been forced into this business by the results of a year's investigation of the milk supplied the board of charities through private dealers. Frequent complaints of the quality of the milk had been received, and tests in the city laboratory surprised even the critics.

It was then decided to establish an experimental dairy on one of the municipal farms in the outskirts of the city and supply from this the poor of one district. The municipality will not engage in delivering milk, but will turn over the product of its dairy to one of the regular milk firms for this purpose.
