## FIXING VALUE OF A MAN

Computation Designed to Help Courts and Jurors in Personal Injury Cases.  
Dr. H. H. Portland, Me., has devised an ingenious system which is expected to be of great help in the assessment of damages in compensation cases. By his use it is said that much time of courts and juries will be saved, for the question of the amount of damages is to be determined by mathematical calculation. Some interesting comment and conclusions based on the proposed handling of an abstract problem are found in a recent issue of an English publication called the Hospital. The tables invented by Dr. H. H. are said to be extensive and look at first glance rather like a book of logarithms. A few illustrations of the method of working them will show how they are applied in compensation cases better than any exposition of the root principles, which would necessarily be long and technical.

A shop assistant, aged 45, suffers entire loss of hearing in one ear through an accident, but is otherwise not affected. He earns \$1 a day, which fixes his total "economic value," according to Dr. H. H.'s table, at \$30.00. The damage to the "functional ability" of the body (abbreviated "F") is found by referring to the tables to be \$12; therefore that which remains is \$18 of the normal F. The damage to the "competing ability" (C) is much less according to the table. Now the "earning ability" (E) is found by multiplying together the new F and C, and comes out at \$6.44 of the normal. Since the total economic value was originally \$30.00 and is now only \$6.44, the diminution of \$23.56 represents the loss sustained. To this has been added such items as pain and suffering, medical expenses, loss of time during recovery, and so on; and the result shows the total compensation to which the man is entitled.

A rather more complicated case will show how Dr. H. H.'s system is prepared to deal with more involved injuries. Suppose the same shop assistant suffered total loss of sight in one eye, total loss of hearing in one ear and loss of the left hand at the wrist joint. The loss of F for the amputation is 6.50, for the loss of sight \$15, for that of hearing \$12. Now sight and hearing are of a similar order, and the table requires that the coefficients of loss be added, not multiplied together. Therefore, the total loss of F for these two is 4.50. Thus, for the amputation alone F equals 6.50, and for the eye and ear alone F equals 9.00. Not being of the same order, these coefficients have to be multiplied; the total of F after the accident is therefore 4.50 of the normal. Now, in this case the competing ability is held to be damaged more than F, and is reckoned as equal to the square of the latter. Thus, E equals C multiplied by F, equals the square of 4.50 multiplied by 6.50, equals 0.7594. In other words, this man has lost \$24.24 of his economic value of \$30.00.

It would be easy to point out omissions in the tables, objections to the uniform system of rating everyone on the basis

of his actual salary at the moment, failure to take into account the differing exigencies of different occupations, and many other points which courts of law or arbitration rightly consider in fixing compensation. But in any case Dr. H. H.'s claims no infallibility for his tables and admits that some of them may have to be altered.

Even loss of taste is provided for in the tables; for total loss of taste the allowance is 6.50 of F.

The difficulty about the comparative importance of various organs in different occupations is got over by the allowance made with regard to C, the "competing ability." It seems to be a matter of discretion in working this out, how much this function shall be held to be damaged as compared with F. But if this is left to the discretion it becomes a matter of argument; doubtless the employer would estimate the damage to C on a much more liberal table than the employer would. Herein lies plentiful opportunity for skillful advocacy; so Dr. H. H.'s invention is not likely to affect the earnings of lawyers even if it were adopted. In all skilled professions an extra factor of technical ability is brought into the arithmetic; and this again provides plenty of scope for fixing compensation. But in any case Dr. H. H.'s tables and claims no infallibility for his tables and admits that some of them may have to be altered.
