ORR'S RIGHT HAND IS BROKEN

Injury Received in Last Contest When He Touches Out Hartzell, Who Tries to Steal Third, in Fourth.

PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 3.—This was an unfortunate day for the Philadelphia champions. The weather was too cold and blustery for their pitchers to get a good tuning up for the world's series and Orr, the first substitute infielder, had his right hand broken. Philadelphia won the first game, 13 to 10, and New York the second, called on account of darkness at the end of the sixth inning.

ORR'S INJURY. Orr's injury was received in the second game when he touched out Hartzell, who tried to steal third base in the fourth. Hartzell's spikes were driven into Orr's hand and one of the bones was fractured. This was the second accident of the series with New York. Catcher Schanz having had his hand hurt by a foul tip yesterday, Plank pitched three innings and in the second season was touched up for three singles, which, with errors by Plank and Collins, netted the visitors three runs. Plank also gave two passes, one each in the first and third innings. Shawkey was in poor form and was taken out in the sixth inning.
