# News from the Insurance Field

## Nebraska Companies Have Millions on Deposit with State

In a report published by The Bee recently, showing the amount of deposits of Nebraska companies with the insurance commissioner at Lincoln, a typographical error made it appear that the Lion Bonding and Surety company of Omaha had \$2,000, whereas the amount that company has on deposit is \$231,430. **Insurance Notes and Personals.**  
Fire losses in Chicago for the first seven months of the year run over \$1,000,000 below the record for the same period last year.  
The West Virginia insurance department has ruled that no insurance agent shall divide commissions or give any compensation of any kind to any person in the state for assisting in obtaining closed, but no one attached any special importance to the announcement. It is said that the saloonkeepers or at least a number of them are openly defiant of the board and make no bones about their intentions to operate on Sunday.  
The temper of the saloonkeepers in regard to the observance of the liquor laws may be gathered from the fact that within the last few months a great many have painted their doors and windows, shutting out the curious eyes of any one minded to observe whether the places were closed at 8 o'clock or not. Many of the saloonkeepers who did not paint their windows used shades and screens of wire and some piled boxes in front of the windows, it is said.  
A week ago the board referred to the city attorney on the legality of the screens, etc. City Attorney Murphy without any comment cited the section of the statutes dealing with the matter. The law is strict and says that any one convicted of using screens or obstructions in front of the doors or windows of a saloon should be fined and the license of the saloon suspended. The board has, in the discretion of the judge and have his license revoked. No licenses have been revoked and no complaints filed.  
**Local Bar Association.**  
Attorneys in South Omaha may organize a bar association among themselves for the purpose of prosecuting outside attorneys whom it is claimed use unprofessional conduct in getting damage suits against corporations in South Omaha. For a number of years South Omaha attorneys have complained of the intrusion of Omaha lawyers into their special preserve in the Magic City. Lately the feeling is said to have become aggravated by the alleged unprofessional conduct of certain Omaha attorneys.  
South Omaha attorneys say that a number of Omaha attorneys solicit business in personal injury cases openly or through agents termed "runners." These "runners" are said to be paid a certain per cent of the recovery money. The work of the "runner" is to visit the family of the injured or bereaved one and advertise his favorite attorney as the one who above all else can win damage suits. If the touted attorney gets the case and wins a money judgment the "runner" gets a per cent.  
Some South Omaha attorneys claim that suits have been taken away from them and turned over to active Omaha attorneys. A number of times it was decided to bring the subject to the notice of the bar association, but lately it was decided that a better move might be the organization of the South Omaha attorneys into an association. If organized, this association, it is said, will secure the services of a detective to trace down the "runners" and their principals and the connection between them. The evidence gathered would then be presented to the Omaha Bar association with a request for summary action against offenders against legal ethics.

### APPAIRS AT SOUTH OMAHA

#### Fire and Police Board Issues Another Order to Saloonists.

#### TO KEEP WINDOWS CLEAR

**Magic City Lawyers Are Considering Plan to Form Bar Association for Their Mutual Betterment.**

Screens and obstructions must be removed from before the doors and windows of saloons in South Omaha, according to the orders issued yesterday by the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners, Devine and Donahue sitting. The orders were in written form and Chief of Police John Briggs was furnished with a copy at once. He made a tour of the city informing the saloonkeepers that obstructions and screens must be removed from the doors and windows of their places.  
The ukase was expected, it having been several days since the board gave an "order." It was said last night that a special effort would be made to see that the saloonkeepers closed up and stayed
