COLD WAVE IS SPREADING

Will Cover Nearly All United States Within Three Days.

BEGINS IN THE NORTHWEST

It Makes Its Appearance in the North Pacific States and This Region Will Be the Hardest Hit.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 4.—A cold wave, with below-zero temperatures in the entire west will spread over almost the entire country within the next three days, a special bulletin of the weather bureau announced today. The northwest will feel the cold almost immediately and will be hardest hit. Indications of the cold wave made their appearance over the north Pacific today in an area of pronounced high pressure, the first of the present winter. Areas of low pressure prevail over the south Pacific and interior of the country. In this combination of atmospheric conditions weather experts see the first general cold wave of the winter over the United States.
