Reclamation Service, made a special trip from North Platte to Omaha, Nebraska, Jan. 14, 1913, by which time all applications for the purchase of storage rights in the Pathfinder reservoir should be on file with the Department of the Interior. To arouse more enthusiasm during the last winter in the purchase of storage water rights in the North Platte chamber of commerce ran a special train from North Platte to Omaha.

Ditch Companies Slow. Notwithstanding these facts, however, the ditch companies have been slow to take advantage of this opportunity and only a few made application for the purchase of water at this time, but it is to be hoped that an extension of time will be granted by the reclamation service in which the ditch companies may make such applications.

In the last few years the North Platte valley has gained very rapidly in diversified farming. The second largest beet sugar factory in the United States has been built at Scott's Bluff. Thousands of tons of sugar beets are raised annually in this valley and delivered to this factory.

Preble's Recommendations. He makes the following recommendations:

Smaller unit farms recommended: 500-600 acres subject to irrigation in North Platte valley, and only 25,000 acres actually irrigated in 1912.

Recommend further development of present ditches before building any new ones.

Careless use of water for irrigation has caused a large amount of seepage.

Recommend limiting amount of appropriation to two and one-half acre feet in the aggregate during any one season.

Recommend the building of reservoirs. No dams should be built without having had the plans of the same approved.

Ideal system of handling an irrigation canal is under the irrigation district system.

Irrigation bonds should be approved and registered in state auditor's office and state treasurer should be authorized to purchase the same with school funds.

Wyoming and Colorado are fast using all the water in streams which head in these states and are shutting Nebraska out.

Power developments, three large ones. Many small developments have been made.

A survey of the important streams which would show the amount of power that could be developed and the various locations of power plants should be made.

Recommend the building of reservoirs, a corporation for procuring, purchasing, holding an interest in a water right in this state.

Supervision of Roads. Under supervision of this office, county commissioners to have charge of roads in counties; do away with township road overseers.

Appointment of county highway engineer by county commissioners subject to approval of state engineer.

State engineer's office to be simply advisory.

State engineer has prepared a standard set of plans of bridges to meet the requirements of all counties.

Standard sets of bridge plans prepared by state engineer should be adopted by all counties.

State aid bridges, so designed to be as nearly permanent as possible. This law has done much to stimulate the interest of counties in building permanent bridges and has been a good thing.

State engineer's office should make proper surveys and estimates for all proposed road bridges and furnish all plans free of cost for this work.

OMAHA BACKS UP REGENTS

Cornhusker Alumni Go on Record for Removal of Uni Campus.

TO TAKE VOTE OF STATE SENATE

Arrangements Being Made for Referendum Poll of All Members of Association Living Out of Commonwealth.

The Omaha Alumni Association of the University of Nebraska Thursday night adopted a resolution endorsing the recommendation of regents of the university for removal of the several colleges of the school from the present campus in Lincoln to the state farm, at the annual meeting of the local organization, held in the University club quarters.

Considerable discussion of the resolution took place before its adoption, and only two men—both Omaha members of the executive committee of the Nebraska State Alumni Association, which recently went on record against removal—were heard to protest against the proposed endorsement of the well considered act of the regents and the chancellor. Many Omaha alumni spoke on the subject, and all, with the two exceptions, Dean Ringer and H. F. Leavitt, spoke soundly and enthusiastically for the removal.

Officers Also Chosen.

Officers for the ensuing year were elected, and a motion to have the officers and board of directors decide upon a plan for getting a vote of all the alumni of the university living in this state, on the removal question, was passed. The officers selected were: Frank Woodland, who was given a second term as president; Robert Manley, vice president; Clyde E. Elliott, secretary; Robert Switzer, treasurer; Dr. W. P. Wherry, Dr. John M. Betts, William C. Ramsey, E. Foster and Alvin Johnson, directors.

Lincoln papers were represented by reporters. One of those journalists spoke for a few minutes in an effort to explain why the Lincoln press had published untruthful tales about the Omaha alumni and their efforts. He declared that the press of the capital city probably felt chagrined because it had been scooped on the recommendation of the regents for removal of the state university campus.

Text of Resolution.

The resolution favoring removal of the campus is:

Whereas, The Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska have, after a careful consideration and a personal investigation, recommended and urged the removal of the university from its present location to the state farm, and

Whereas, This recommendation has been concurred in and supported by the chancellor and the head dean of the University of Nebraska; and

Whereas, The special committee appointed by the legislature of 1911 to consider the question of removal, reported in favor of removal; now therefore be it Resolved, By the Omaha Alumni Association of the University of Nebraska that we have the utmost confidence in the foresight, disinterestedness and good judgment of the board of regents, and we hereby pledge them our active cooperation and support in the endeavor to secure such removal at this time.

THREE TRAINS TRAPPED BY MEXICAN REBELS

EL PASO, Tex., Jan. 17.—The morning southbound passenger train of Wednesday and two troop trains have been trapped by the rebels burning bridges on the Mexican Central railway below Juarez, it was learned definitely today. Among the marooned passengers are many prominent American and Mexican mining and cattle men, including Alberto Terrazas, a millionaire of Chihuahua.

Two Killed in Auto Accident at St. Louis

ST. LOUIS, Jan. 17.—Russell F. Davis of Cleveland, assistant secretary to Mrs. Helene Britton, owner of the St. Louis National League base ball club, and William H. Walters of St. Louis, president of a novelty company, were killed in an automobile accident here today.

The automobile in which they were riding struck a water plug at Grand and Cottage avenues. The impact turned the car around, threw the two men out and tore the cap off the water plug, flooding the street and inundating Davis' body as it lay near the curb.

Davis died a few minutes after he had been taken out of the water by a policeman. Walters was hurled in the air and was dead when picked up.
