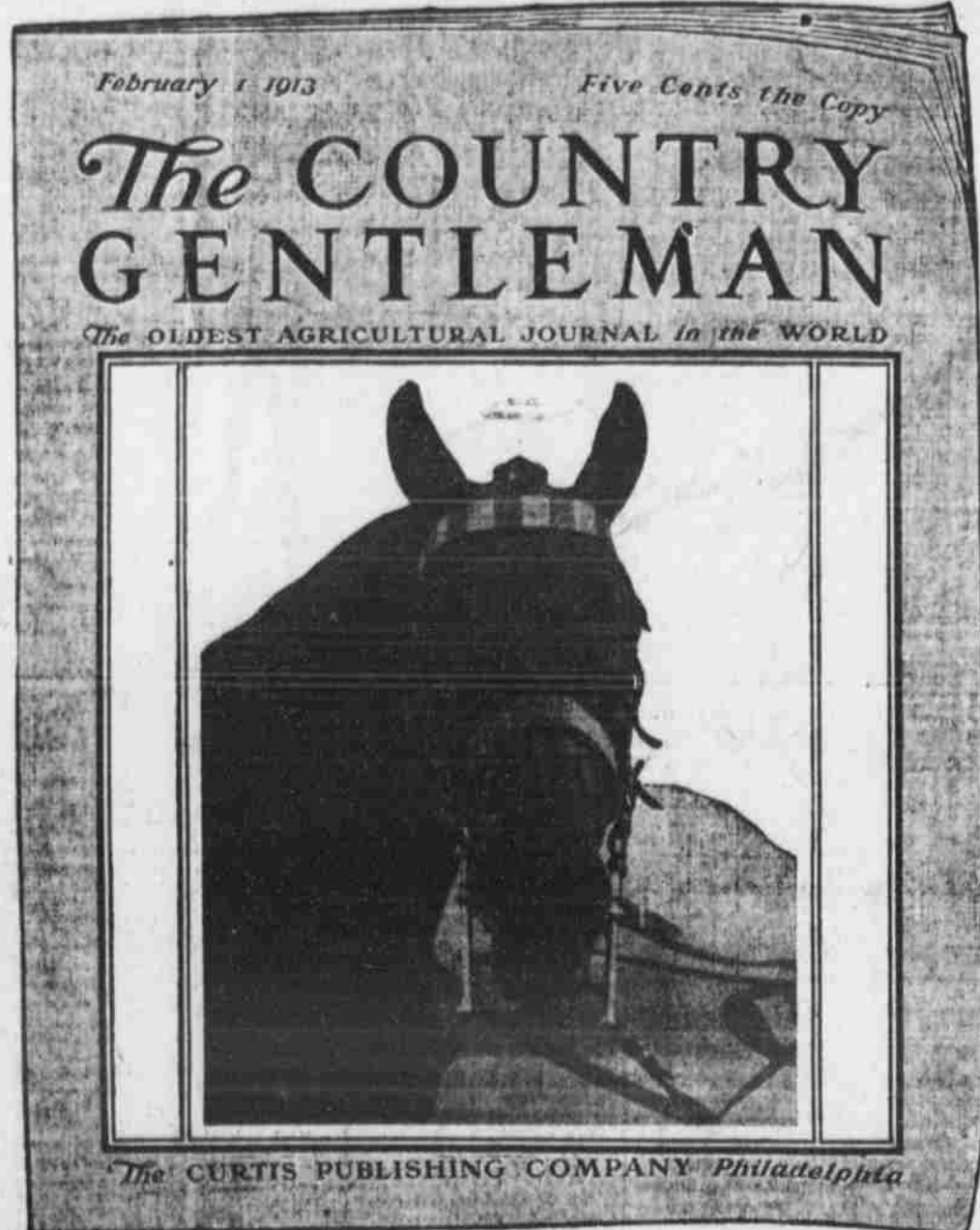

### ROADS' AGENCIES SEPARATED

Union Pacific and Southern Pacific Give Up Joint Agencies.

### WILL CREATE NEW OFFICES

No Changes to Be Made in the Union Pacific Family in This City for Some Time—To Await Court's Order.

In response to the decree of the United States supreme court next Sunday the segregation of the merger of the Union and Southern Pacific roads will have been made complete. This is the information that comes from New York and is received at the Union Pacific headquarters in this city.

After next Sunday at no place in the United States, or elsewhere, will the two Pacific roads maintain joint agencies.

Signs on all windows will be changed, as will all advertising matter. In each city where one agent in the past has handled the business of both roads that agent must give up the business of one of the companies and cast his lot with the other. This will apply even here in Omaha. The name of the Southern Pacific will go off the windows of the buildings at Fourteenth and Farnam streets, the Union Pacific holding its fort. In the event the Southern Pacific desires to do business here it will have to hunt another location and appoint an agent.

The separation of the business of the two Pacific roads applies not only to the passenger, but to the freight traffic as well. In a number of the large cities where joint agencies have been established, it is understood that the agents will elect to remain with the Union Pacific, but at this time neither road is ready to give out the names of the appointees. It is expected that the appointments will be made as early as Saturday in order that Monday morning when the offices open for business, all of the new men may be at their desks.

Just how many new positions will be created by the order is not given out, but it is known that there will be many. Heretofore joint agencies have been maintained in Omaha, Chicago, Cleveland, Pittsburgh, St. Louis, Kansas City, Denver, Salt Lake City, San Francisco and scores of other cities.

Central Pacific and its branches has been settled, the authority of the Union Pacific officials will not be either curtailed or extended.

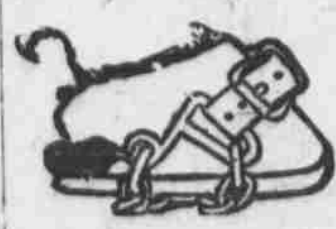
