AFFAIRS AT SOUTH OMAHA

Business Men, at Meeting, Endorse Lee Merger Bill.

CITIZENS' COMMITTEE REPORTS

No City Council Meeting for Lack of Quorum, Owing to Strong Effort of Few to Push Ryan-Pivonka Scheme.

If the gang that is opposing annexation wanted any confirmation of the esteem in which their efforts are held by the solid business men of the town it would have been to their enlightenment to have attended a meeting of twenty-five of the biggest business men in town held last night in an office in the Harmon building. The meeting was called to hear the report of the citizens' charter committee appointed some time ago at a public meeting held in the South Omaha High school building.

Attorney J. P. Breen of Omaha, who was present, explained the provisions of the Lee bill, which, he said, would probably be passed without any trouble. The last apparent objection to the Lee bill and to merger with Omaha was taken away when Breen explained his amendment to the Omaha city charter allowing the city to expend any such additional sum as would be necessary to cover the increased expenses of Greater Omaha by reason of the annexation of South Omaha.

Aged Man Prays in Police Court that Judge Be Lenient

The name of John Napanacs was called out by the court officer in police court. The witnesses were called forward—an aged and bent woman dressed in black and a daughter, probably 12 years of age. Napanacs, the father, was led from the "bull pen" into the court room, where he came face to face with his wife and daughter, whom he had refused to support for the last year.

No Quorum at Council Meeting.

There was no quorum at the city hall last night and as a consequence the city council did not hold a session. The reason of the postponement of the meeting was ascribed to the fact that a desperate attempt to push the Ryan-Pivonka plan through the council in the matter of paying the twenty-nine firemen on the department. It was planned, according to certain members of the council, to force through a measure last night supporting Ryan and Pivonka in their effort to override the rule established by the council in making financial provision for the payment of twenty-six men this year.

New Document Prepared.

In the protest of John E. Watkins and C. W. Sears, a new product of the Hector charter revision committee was taken down to Lincoln yesterday, it was said. The Hector charter revision committee has prepared an annexation bill, part of which is a joke and the rest bombastic, as far as getting an expression of the people goes. The whole question as to annexation is left in the hands of the city council, who, with their own interests at stake will have little qualms in raising all manner of objections to any progress of annexation.

There is going to be a fight, but it is not expected to be in accord with the minds of the Hector charter committee. The Lee bill is fair, and many of the saloon men are in favor of the measure, which makes a special provision that in case of annexation with Omaha the South Omaha saloon keepers will have to pay a pro rata saloon license tax from May, when the South Omaha licenses are issued, to the following January, when the Omaha licenses are granted. The schools and school teachers are taken care of in a supplemental bill. This bill provides that the South Omaha teachers shall be embodied in the Omaha school department on an equal footing with the Omaha school teachers, rating being allowed in accord with the number of years spent in the service in South Omaha. This means an increase of salary for the teachers of the annexed city and a title to the retirement roll for those who have served the required number of years in the same manner as if they had served during the same time in Omaha. The firemen and policemen of South Omaha in case of annexation will have a double shift and a rating in Omaha according to their terms of service in South Omaha. Both services will be protected by a retirement and pension fund.

CALLS VACCINATION VICIOUS

Patron of Lake School Asks for Protection for Children.

WRITES TO BOARD OF EDUCATION

H. S. Seward Says His Two Girls Are Healthy, and He Would Be Doing Them Great Injustice to Permit Vaccination.

Vaccination is vicious and has repudiated it, according to H. S. Seward, 2250 North Nineteenth street, who wrote the Board of Education a letter which was read at a meeting last night, in which he urged the board to instruct Superintendent E. U. Graff to direct the principal of Lake school to receive back his two girls who are now out by order of the health commissioner and will not be permitted to return, unless vaccinated, for twenty-one days.

In his letter Seward says the only cases of smallpox in the vicinity of Lake school are now about well and he sees no reason why his children should not be permitted to return, as they are a healthy pair. The Board of Education referred the letter to the Judiciary committee on the request of the board's attorney, who received the letter and referred it to the board. Seward says:

"I have two little girls who up to this date have been attending school regularly. One is in first A and the other in third A grade. I will never consent to them being vaccinated, as I would not be a party to an act whereby their bodies would become diseased in case they were vaccinated. Vaccination is a vicious custom and is only approved by certain ones of the medical profession, mainly for the fees involved.

"My children are in good health and to vaccinate them would be sinful, even if

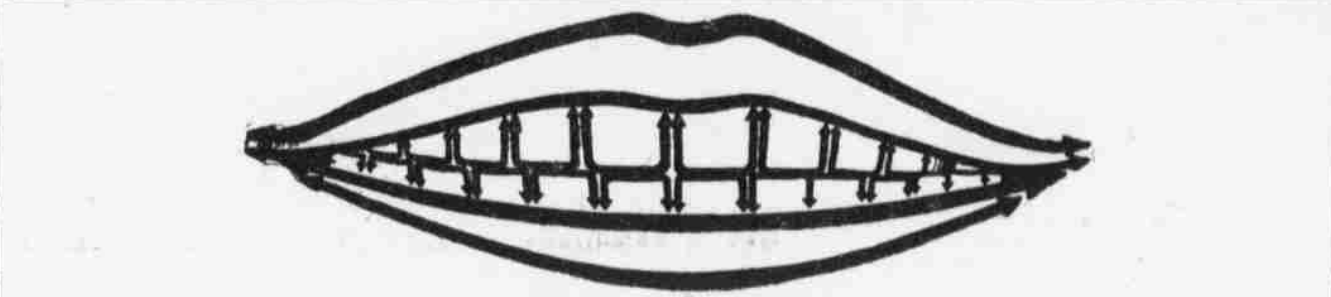
