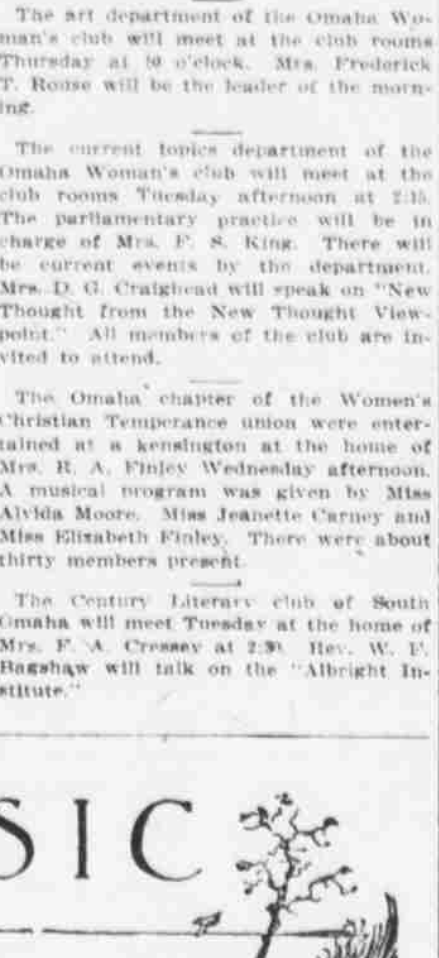

AMERICAN GIRL IS MARRIED TO FRENCH DUKE AT BALTIMORE

BALTIMORE, Feb. 8.—Miss Elinor Douglas Wise, daughter of the late Commander Frederick M. Wise, U. S. N., was married at the cathedral here today to Alphonse Duc De Richelieu, of the Province of France.

Following the service a wedding breakfast was served to about 300 guests, quite a number of whom came from New York, Philadelphia and Washington.

The Duo De Richelieu, who is the inheritor of the name and nobiliary dignities of Cardinal Richelieu, is half American. His mother was Alice Heine, daughter of Michael Heine, a banker of New Orleans.

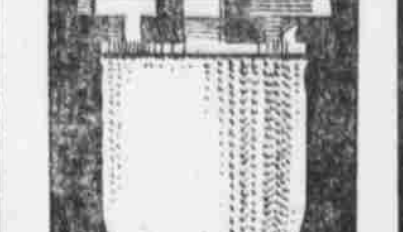
