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NEBRASKA OPTICIANS ELECT

Seventh Annual State Convention is Brought to a Close.

B. B. COMBS IS THE PRESIDENT

Two Men Are Recommended to the Governor for Positions on the Examining Board of Optometry.

The seventh annual convention of the Nebraska State Optical society came to a close with the election of B. B. Combs of Omaha as president of the organization. The selection of Mr. Combs was unanimous.

Other results of the election were: Mrs. Alice Brooks, Hastings, secretary-treasurer; A. W. Niehart, Elmwood, first vice president; A. S. Miller, Madison, second vice president; E. Niewohner of Columbus, Max Edge of Grand Island, F. A. Hallett of Lincoln, legislative and F. A. Hallett of Lincoln were recommended to the governor for appointment to the examining board of optometry.

Several changes were made in the constitution and by-laws of the society and the office of treasurer and secretary consolidated. The annual dues were raised from \$2 to \$3 per annum. John Holste, Jr., of Omaha addressed the convention on "Optical Education." Howard D. Minchin of Rochester, N. Y., delivered an address on "Higher Education for the Optometrist."
