TO REORGANIZE THE ARMY First Step to be Taken Today in Elaborate Scheme. MEN ARE GIVEN NEW STATIONS Purpose to Form the Whole Army into Brigades Instead of Regiments, as is the Plan at Present Time.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 15.—Tomorrow will be taken the first step in the execution of the elaborate scheme for the reorganization of the army, so carefully planned by the war college, when under orders from Secretary Stimson, six battalions of infantry troops, and one squadron of cavalry, will begin to take new stations to which they have been assigned, with the purpose of gradually forming the army as a whole into brigades, consisting of three regiments each.

Dogs Lead Rescuers to Masters' Bodies Seward, Alaska, Feb. 15.—Guided by pack dogs more than 100 miles, rescuers have recovered the bodies of C. C. Chittick and John Keeler, who perished early this month in a blizzard in the Happy river country, 30 miles from Seward. Three days after they had left a road house on the Iditarod trail, four dogs in harness belonging to the men returned, led by the dogs, set out and were guided to a huge snow drift under which lay the bodies of the blizzard victims. When news of the fate of Chittick and Keeler reached Seward relatives of the unfortunate men started with dog trails to bring their bodies out over the 250-mile trail.
