### Wage Legislation as General Statute Opposed by Women

committee of twelve women assisting the state legislative committee in its investigations of wages paid women in Omaha. The committee, however, is opposed to any law fixing a definite minimum wage without regard to age, length of service and efficiency.

In their study of the conditions of working women the committee members have found that in some hundries, factories and other comercial institutions sanitary conditions are far from what they should be and moral influences also could be bettered.

A resolution adopted by the committee of twelve women follows:

A resolution adopted by the committee of twelve women follows:

We, the undersigned committee, after due investigation of the faces and conditions brough, to our observation during the limited time at our disposal in regard to the sanitary conditions, hours of labor and wages naid working girls and women in Omaha, do hereby express our belief tha \$9 per week is a fair and just minimum wage to adult working women (IS years or over), but that any set defined minimum wage law which would include all working girls and women without respect to age, length of service or efficiency would work an injury to the parties who need our fiele most, viz, the young inefficient worker. That said worker, however, must be protected by proper sanitary conditions, lawful hours of habor and a fair and just remuneration for service rendered. We therefore recommend that a board or commission be appointed to defermine a just and fair rate of wages paid to minors, apprentices and learners according to the financial condition of the occupation involved, cost of maintaining and operating said business and profits received. Said board to have absolute control of all matters pertaining to conditions of labor of said minors, apprentices and learners. Further recommend in justice to employers as well as employers, and for the credit of the state of Neuraska, believing that efficiency is the greatest asset in the business world, that all employes be especially urged and trained to strive for efficiency in their particular line of work.
