One Hundred Boatloads of Wheat Sold for Export.

FEAR OVER MAY CORN PRICE

Oats Market Makes Decided Break, but Recovered Some Under the Heavy Buying of Shorts to Cover.

OMAHA, March 13.—In an early trade advance yesterday one firm in the trade advised caution against pressing the selling side of wheat too far on the break. Just such a situation developed before midday, when the May price touched 89c and July 98c. There was moderate buying for a rally by conservative interests in the Chicago trade.

YORK messages confirmed export sales of 100 boatloads of Duluth wheat at Buffalo late yesterday, and there was a report of another sale on an inland wharf at Chicago, both to Baltimore and the Gulf. It was this business which gave a snap to the buying side of the market the last hour of trading. The May price advanced 1/2c to 90c, and July 99c. The heavy run of wheat to Minneapolis continued, but stocks there have increased 170,000 bu. so far this week, which they were decreased a year ago.

Reports give no indication of a revival in the flour trade. Certain houses in Chicago, credited with the task of liquidating La Salle street holdings of wheat, closed their orders for the week. 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NEW YORK STOCK MARKET

All Prices Move Uncertainly, Ending with General Advances.

CALL MONEY HELD FIRM

New Haven is Conspicuously Weak, Falling to 120 1/2, Bottom Figure Since 1878—Seventy-Five.

NEW YORK, March 13.—Prices moved in an uncertain way in the stock exchange today, ending the session with general advances. Bear traders attacked the live stocks sharply in the outset, forcing down quotations for a time. Depression in the European markets and a general foreign buying movement, however, held the market steady. Call money rates held firm. A further break occurred in foreign exchange today, the dollar falling to 120 1/2, bottom figure since 1878, and the accompanying engagement of \$700,000 gold for Berlin and \$2,000,000 for Paris was announced. Bear traders justified in putting out a line, but selling was on a limited scale and the market gradually rallied and grew quiet.

The most positive movement of the day occurred in the last hour after the receipt of news from Washington that the House had passed the Hartman bill for dissolution of the Hartman properties had been presented to the attorney general, with indications that it had been received favorably. On strength of this announcement Union Pacific mounted a point above its previous low level, closing with a net gain of 2 points. Southern Pacific, Reading, Steel and Amalgamated established gains. Stocks showed signs of irregularity, but a downward tendency. Total sales, par value, \$1,600,000. United States bonds were unchanged on all.
