EGGS AND CHEESE LOWER

Butter Remains at the Same Price, White Meat Goes Up.

GRAPE FRUIT QUITE PLENTIFUL

Vegetables Are Priced the Same as Last Week—Lilies Are Coming In for the Easter Display.

Eggs and cheese are among the commodities that dropped in price during the last week. Both declined 2 cents. Eggs may now be bought for 18 cents a dozen and cheese ranges from 15 to 25 cents a pound. Butter experienced no change in price. The Elgin board reported the same price as a week ago and consequently the Omaha market followed suit.

All meats have risen within the last three weeks, some kinds as much as 2 1/2 cents a pound. The reason is not altogether clear. Butchers say the end of Lent and the anticipation of a greater demand have brought about the rise. Beef round steaks are 15 cents a pound.

priced at 10 cents and loins at 12 1/2 cents a pound. The best hams are to be had at 17 1/2 cents a pound. Bacon ranges from 15 to 25 cents a pound. All fish remain at the same prices.

The end of the orange season is at hand, according to Albert King, manager of Hayden Brothers' grocery department. The fruit is now being shipped in from Florida and the best sells wholesale for

\$4 a box. Grape fruit is taking the place of the orange. They may be bought at 5 to 10 cents apiece.

Strawberries have declined 10 cents within the last two weeks, but still are beyond the reach of the "common people." They sell at 50 cents a box. Mushrooms also stand at a pretty fair figure, retailing on the local market at 50 cents a pound.

Vegetables have undergone comparatively no change in price. Head lettuce is priced at 5 to 7 1/2 cents a head. Spinach is 15 cents a peck. Fancy cucumbers are 15 cents each. Carrots, beets, turnips, radishes and shallots sell three bunches for a dime. Cauliflower is quite scarce, what is shipped in from California selling at 7 1/2 cents a pound. Cabbage can be bought at a penny a pound. Potatoes are 15 cents a peck.

In preparation for Easter, orders are being placed with the florists for lilies. The price now asked is 15 cents a bloom. They will be on the market for Ash Wednesday sale.
