Present System of School Land Taxation Expensive Proposition.

TREASURER IN FAVOR OF SALE

Money Invested Would Retain Much More Than Now Is Brought In.

There is one section of school land in that county which under lease to the present owner is bringing to the state a revenue of \$14,000 a year...

"The state of Nebraska now has 1,714,000 acres of school lands bringing in a revenue each year to the state of \$168,656...

"In addition to this the state would receive in taxes from this land over \$2,300 each year on the purchase price alone...

"To sum the whole proposition up, the state is now receiving \$168,656 in revenue each year from its school lands. If this land is sold at the minimum figure...

RAILROADS DROP DISSOLUTION PLAN

(Continued from Page One.) of the Union Pacific, gave out this statement by order of the board of directors: "The railroad commission of California having failed to approve certain provisions of the plan outlined in the circular to stockholders dated February 10, 1913, in respect of which provisions the approval of the commission was necessary or advisable, the plan and the agreement embodying the same, including the offer of stock in the Southern Pacific company for subscription to stockholders, cannot become effective. Accordingly said offer of stock for subscription to stockholders is withdrawn and subscription warrants are void and of no effect."

First Plan Modified.

The first plan, which was submitted to the circuit judges on February 24, was modified because the California Railway commission objected to the clause providing for the lease of the Southern Pacific short line from Oakland to Sacto to the Central Pacific, which in turn was to be taken over by the Union Pacific, and for the provision for the exclusive joint use of the cutoff by the two major Harpman lines.

Abandoned Plan.

The abandoned plan, abandoned today, provided for a preferential traffic agreement between the Southern Pacific and Union Pacific for the use of the cutoff. The abandonment of the plan came as a surprise, as Mr. Lovett and other stockholders were fully expecting to present the dissolution arrangement to the circuit judges for approval. After his arrival in St. Louis, Mr. Lovett received a copy of the protest filed by the California railroad commission with the attorney general objecting to the preferential traffic agreement.
