AUDITOR BARTON'S OPINION

Writes Letter on Separation of Insurance Department. The insurance bill which is being discussed in the senate at the present time seems to attract attention from all portions of the state, and this morning Auditor Barton received from State Auditor Howard the following letter, which is of considerable interest, as it shows the attitude of the ex-auditor in the matter:

I note with considerable interest the discussion of the insurance bill now before our state senate. As my reports will show, I am in favor of separating the insurance department from the auditor's office, but not by placing this department in the hands of state officers who are now overrunning with business.

INSURANCE BILL AMENDED

Placek Cuts Out Section With Regard to Rebates. (From a Staff Correspondent.) LINCOLN, March 17.—(Special Telegram.)—The first fight on the insurance bill before the senate came this afternoon on section 14, which provided, among other things, that the amount of insurance wherein the insured has accented or secured, either directly or indirectly, any rebate of the premium or agent's commission, shall be reduced in such proportion as the amount or value of such rebate, commission or dividend bears to the total premium on such policy.

WIFE OF FORMER CHINESE PRESIDENT IS INJURED

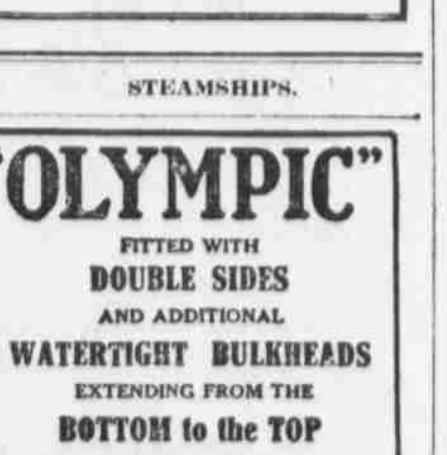

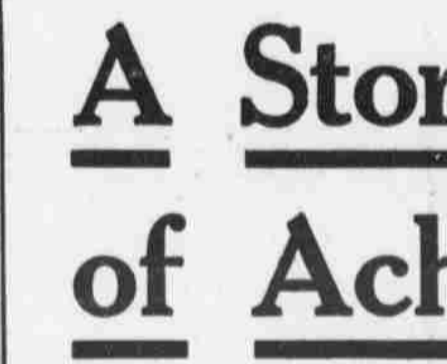
