WILSON CUTS ALL RED TAPE

President Opens Government Resources to Homeless Thousands.

EXECUTIVE MAY GO HIMSELF

Treasury Department Sends Surgeon General Blue to Flood District to Preserve Public Health.

WASHINGTON, March 28.-President Wilson threw open today the resources of the federal government to the home less thousands fighting against water flame and famine in Ohio and Indiana More than \$550,000 has already been spent and the president has determined that no red tape will stand in the way of relief anywhere.

Secretary Garrison of the War depart ment left today with orders from the president to survey the situation in Ohio and direct the government's rollef expeditions, and Mr. Wilson annuanced if communication with the flood districts continued imperfect and the prametice of the chief executive was required to insue emergency executive orders he would go

to the zone of the disaster blinsel". The president did little else today except work on the flood situation and is ready to set aside other business perore him to assist the authorities of Ohio and Indiana. The entire situation will be can vassed by the cabinet tomorrow.

Postmaster General Burleson is co templating a quick journey to Ohlo if the mail situation is not soon improved Mall routes across the continent are badly affected and the tank of disease tangling the mail service to points in Ohlo and Indiana untouched by floods has reached a crisis. Assistant are being ordered to the flood region from hearby sittes and stamps and supplies are being rushed to places that have jost the'r stock in the floods.

Departments Are at Work Not only were the War and the Post office deportments straining every etfort to be of assistance, but the Navy department issued orders to its recruiting stations in the central west to send narines, physicians and officers trained in rescue work to co-operate with the army medical staffs.

Power boats and skiffs were dispaiched from stations on the Great


