Garments Urgently Required Made and Delivered in Utmost Secrecy Among Those Who Had to Have Help.

In no instance has a woman been asked to assist, it has been almost impossible to give work to all who have called at the different relief stations throughout the storm district.

Headquarters at Auditorium.

At the Auditorium the committee in charge of the relief work has purchased scores of lots of cloth and hundreds of spoils of thread. These have been sent to any society that has called for material and the result is that hundreds of garments have been made by the women of the city for the relief work.

Nurses on the Job.

The Visiting Nurse association of the city has assisted greatly in this work. Not only has the society aided in the sewing, but also in the nursing of the injured. It has been a common sight to see a visiting nurse stop at several doors where she thought there might be an injured person and ask if she could do anything for them.

Church Societies Active.

The Ladies' Aid society of the First Presbyterian church had meetings each day in the church parlors, and under the direction of Mrs. G. L. Bradley, Mrs. J. J. Morrison and Mrs. Edwin Hart Jenks they have made hundreds of garments.

Work Required Tact.

The women have used a great deal of tact in handling these cases, and never has a confidence been betrayed when they have given their bundles and returned to hasten to another family whose home is gone and are sheltered by four walls of another house.

Difficulties of the Work.

Besides working with the relief societies, many prominent women have sought those who are too proud or too modest to come to the stations. These are the difficult ones to help, but when the assistance is given in a proper manner the help is accepted.

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are among those who aided in the distribution of the work. At the African Methodist Episcopal church these women not only sewed, but served meals to all who came for food. They worked with the same cause at heart as did their white sisters and worked just as earnestly.

At Relief Stations.

The relief station at Fortieth and Farnham streets had equally as many earnest workers. Many of these women have their own cars and while they assisted with the work at the station and in aiding others in locating families who needed help they gave instructions to the drivers to aid any person who needed them.

Neighborhood Gatherings.

Hundreds of women who have not worked in any of the gatherings sewing have asked a few neighbors in for the afternoon and during that time the stitches have been on garments for the relief work.
