LINCOLN, Neb., April 15 .- (Special.)-A little echo of the legislation which resulted in the passage of senate file No. 17, the Omaha water bill, was heard in the senate this morning when senate file No. 386, introduced by Saunders, providing for a change in the Slocumb law which would enable the people of Omaha to vote on the proposition of the time for closing and opening saloons, was brought up.

In speaking in favor of the bill, Saundselves were interested alone and was along the line of home rule for Omaha. Hoagland of Lincoln got into the fray right away and called the senator to task for his inconsistency in the matter You say that giving the people a chance to vote on matters in which they are interested locally, shouted the senator, has been the policy of this legislature. Why don't you be consistent? You are the author of a bill passed by this legisature denying the people of Omaha and its suburban towns affected by that bill a right to vote on the proposition of jurisdiction over their own water plant You voted for that bill. It denies the right of your own people to vote on matters which affect them, and now you turn round and advocate home rule. Why don't you be consistent in this home rule


