

BRUSSELS, Belgium, April 15 .- More than a third of the total number of workmen in Belgium were on strike this morn-Figures gathered by the Associated press from all the provinces except Antwerp and West Flanders showed a total of 256,000 strikers. In Antworp and West Flanders, where the socialists are weakest, there are about 14.000 strikers, making in all 270,000 men.
