TO FORM MUTUAL COMPANY Omaha Manufacturers May Found Own Insurance Corporation.

DEPENDS ON WORKMEN'S LAWS Final Passage of Compensation Bill and Employers' Liability Law Means that Organization Will Become Reality.

When the new workmen's compensation and employers' liability law goes into effect in Nebraska July 17, the Omaha Manufacturers' association will establish a mutual insurance company to be operated within the state by Nebraska manufacturers.

It is probable that after the establishment of the mutual insurance company by the Omaha association the Nebraska State Manufacturers' association will organize a similar company or join with the Omaha members.
