CROPS COULD NOT BE BETTER

So Says the Weekly Crop Report of the Burlington Road.

WHEAT FAR ABOVE AVERAGE

Corn Planting in Well Under Way and All Conditions Are Most Favorable for All the Growing Crops.

The Burlington's crop and soil report for the week ending May I shows a condition in Nebraska that has seldom if ever, attained. After summarizing the information sent him by company experts and others, General Superintendent Allen, writing to General Manager Hotdrege, says:

'In Nebraska winter wheat could not be uniformally in better condition than it is at the time of making this report. Our agents and officers report the condition of winter wheat from 100 to 125 per cent of the average crop. I do not think 15 to 20 per cent above the average Theater Managers ... is an exaggeration.

In giving these figures, Superintendent Allen does not take the figures of any one year, but, instead, takes, the 10-year average, which is 89 per cent.

With reference to spring grain, the superintendent says that seeding is generally finished and that many of the fields begin to show green. In Kansas and on the McCook division in Nebraska about 10 per cent of the corn has been planted, but elsewhere planting has hardly began, yet the ground is being rapidly prepared for a large acreage. The weather of last week was unusually favorable for sugar beets and most vegetables.
