Graff Says He Will Have One in Parental Institution.

LITTLE ATTENTION TO BOOKS

Time of the Leads to Be Occupied with Manual Arts, So They May Learn Trade to Which They Are Best Adapted.

There will be a justification for the teacher who calls a pupil in the special parental school Superintendent E. U. Graff will establish next year "a little devil" for the superintendent intends to install a printing press at this school and train numerous printer's devils in that institution.

"The main thing is to find a man who can take charge of the school and manage it well," said Mr. Graff. "That is now the greatest problem. When we have the faculty we will soon install the necessary equipment." Mr. Graff recently made a trip through the east in search of men for the positions in this special parental school, but found none who were trained for such work.

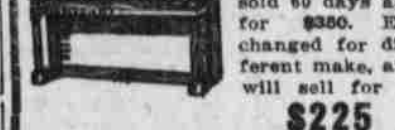
