### Oath of the Clan-na-Gael.

The following is the oath taken by the members of that famous Romish Catholic society:

"I (name in full) do solemnly swear in the presence of Almighty God, that I will isbor while life is left in me to establish and defend a republican form of government in Ireland; that I will keep secret the names with the constitution and laws of the same that I will preserve the funds of thi order for the cause of Irish revolution alon as specified in the constitution; that I will deem it my special duty and mission to promote and foster sentiments of union brotherly love, nationality, among all Irish. I take this obligation without any mental reservation, holding the same forever binding upon me, and that any violation thereof, or desertion of my duty to the brotherhood is infamous, and merits the everest punishment, so help me God."

This oath the candidate is abjured to keep at the hazzard of his life. It was printed in the Chicago Inter Ocean and was sworn to be correct at the Cronin trial. It was reported by said paper November 17, 1894. Priests and bishops act as chaplains for this holy (?) order

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
