REINACH WANTS HIS CREDENTIALS Factional Fight Expected in the A. P. A. Convention.

What promises to provoke quite a lively difficulty in the ranks of the American Protective Association will be the service of a writ of replevin upon ex-Captain of Police Villiers, of Lake View, this morning. The papers were obtained yesterday afternoon by Chas. Reinach in Justice Foster's court. The present difficulty originated over the retention of credentials to the state convention of that organization, which convenes this morning at Masonic hall, at No. 122 Twenty-Second street. Reinach claims to be a delegate from Local Council No. 42, whose headquarters are at Lincoln avenue and Diversey street. The credentials, he says, he presented to Villiers in order to obtain a card of admission to the convention. He was denied the card and refused the custody of his credentials. The trouble originated at the time of Reinach's candidacy for clerk of the criminal court on the Independent American Citizens ticket last fall. Theodore Gestefeld and Reinach became involved in a factional fight. and since then there has been constant strife. Reinsch will accompany the constable in the morning, when it is expected that service will be secured upon the writ of replevin, and if successful in gaining admission, will immediately bring the matter to the attention of the assemblage. Reinach's faction await this morning's results with considerable anxiety because if unfavorable it may be the means of bolting the convention-Chicago Inter-Ocean, January 22.


