Articles of Incorporation. We, whose names are subscribed to these Articles of Incorporation, do hereby associate ourselves for the purpose of forming a body corporate under the laws of the state of Nebraska. ARTICLE I. The name of this corporation shall be "The Nebraska Cremation and Trust Company" of Omaha, Nebraska. ARTICLE II. The principal place of business of said Corporation shall be at Omaha, Douglas county, Nebraska. ARTICLE III. The general nature of the business to be transacted shall be to advocate the substitution of incineration for the present system of earth burial; to purchase, lease, acquire or dispose of such real or personal property as may be deemed necessary or proper for the general business; to build a crematory and to conduct the same; to receive and hold the property of the deceased and to dispose of the same in accordance with the wishes of the deceased or his legal representatives. ARTICLE IV. To act as the executor, trustee or administrator of the estates of deceased members of this Corporation, and others, so as to insure the same in accordance with the wishes of the deceased or his legal representatives. ARTICLE V. The amount of capital stock authorized is fixed at twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000). The Company shall once business when one or more shares are subscribed for, and the number of shares shall consist of five thousand (5,000). ARTICLE VI. The Corporation shall commence business as soon as the Articles are filed with the County Clerk of Douglas county, Nebraska, and shall continue for a period of twenty-five (25) years unless sooner terminated by the consent of the holders of two-thirds (2/3) of the subscribed shares of stock. ARTICLE VII. The affairs of the Corporation shall be conducted by the following officers, to-wit: A Board of Directors consisting of seven (7) men, who shall elect from their own number at their first regular meeting in each year, a President, Vice-President, a Secretary and a Treasurer. The Directors are to be elected at the annual meeting of the Corporation on the second Monday of January; the place and hour to be determined by the Secretary, who shall notify each stockholder, and hold over until their successors are elected and have qualified. Until the annual meeting shall take place on the second Monday of January, 1895, the following are and shall be Directors: Henry Ehrenpfort, Herman Reinhold, John O. Yelzer, Walter Breen, M. R. Atkinson, James B. Donnelly, Herman H. Ver Mehren; and the following shall constitute the officers: Walter Breen, President; John O. Yelzer, Vice-President; Herman Reinhold, Secretary; Henry Ehrenpfort, Treasurer. ARTICLE VIII. Conveyances of real estate to be held by the Corporation shall be a deed pursuant to resolutions of the stockholders by a meeting called for that purpose, in the name of the body corporate, and shall be signed by the President and attested to by the Secretary. All such conveyances shall be deposited in a book to be kept by the Corporation in Bank shall be signed by the President and countersigned by the Treasurer. ARTICLE IX. The highest amount of indebtedness to which the Corporation is at any time to be indebted shall be placed at a sum equal to one-fourth (1/4) of the paid up capital stock. The private property of the stockholders and members shall be exempt from the corporate debts. ARTICLE X. By-Laws not inconsistent with these Articles shall be drawn up and adopted by the Board of Directors; the same may hereafter be changed, amended or repealed at any regular meeting of said Board of Directors, on a vote of not less than five (5) Direc-
