The A. P. A. Principles With the Canon Law and Several Oaths of the Roman Catholic Church,

and Then Judge for Yourself Which Have the True Spirit of Americanism in Them, the A P. A. Principles or the Diabolical **Obligations Taken by Rome's** Minions.

A. P. A. Principles.

The following are the declarations of prin siples adopted by the National Council of ins A. P. A. at DesMoines:

"Loyalty to true Americanism, which knows neither birth, place, race, creed, nor party, is the first requirement for memberabin in the American Protective Association The American Protective Association is set a political party, and does not control the political affiliations of its members; but is teaches them to be intensely active in the discharge of their political duties in or out of party lines, because it believes that all bound solid by a conscientious discharge of the duties of citizenship by every individual. "While tolerant of all creeds, it holds that subjection and support to any political power not controlled by American citizens, and conscience. which claims equal if not greater sovereignty than the government of the United States, is irreconcliable with American citizenship. It is, therefore, opposed to the holding of offices 30. Heretics are to and paternal rights. In state or national government by any subject or supporter of such ecclesiastical power.

"We uphold the constitution of the United States of America, and no portion of it more than its guarantee of religious liberty, but we 'eld this religious liberty to be guaranrow to the individual, and not to mean that under its protection any un-American occlesinstical power can claim any absolute control over the education of children, growing under the stars and stripes.

We consider the non-sectarian free public school the bulwark of American institutions, the best place for the education of American children To keep them such, we protest against the employment of subjects of any un-American ecclesiastical power as officers ar teachers of our public schools.

"We condemn the support out of the pubis treasury by direct appropriation or by contract of any sectarian school, reform-story or other institution not owned and controlled by public authority.

"Believing that exemption from taxation is equivalent to a grant of public funds, we domand that no real or personal property be exampt from taxation, the title to which is by all. not vested in the national or state governments, or in any of their sub-divisions

"We protest against the enlistment in the United States army, navy, or the militia of any state, of any person not an actual citizen of the United States.

"We demand for the protection of our citisen laborers the prohibition of the importation of pauper labor, and the restriction of all immigration to persons who cannot show heir ability and honest intention to become alf-supporting American citizens.

"We demand the change of the naturalization laws by a repeal of the act authorizing the naturalization of minors, without a previous declaration of intention, and by providing that no alien shall be naturalized or permitted to vote in any state in the union who cannot speak the language of the land. and who cannot prove seven years' consect tive residence in this country from the date of his declaration of his intention.

"We protest against the gross negligence and laxity with which the judiciary of our land administer the present naturalization laws, and against the practice of naturaliz ing aliens at the expense of committees or condidates as the most prolific source of the present prostitution of American citizenship to the basest uses.

"We demand that all hospitals, asylums,

I do further declare the doctrine of the church of England, of the Calvinists, Huguenots and other Protestants, to be damnable and those to be damned who will not forsake the same.

"I do further declare that I will help, assist and advise all or any of his holiness' agents in any place wherever I shall be, and to do my utmost to extirpate the Protestant doctrine and to destroy all their pretended ower, regal or otherwise. I do further promtse and declare that, notwithstanding I may be permitted by dispensation to assume any retical religion (Protestant denominations) or the propagation of the mother church's interest, to keep secret and private all her agents' counsels as they entrust me, and not to divulge, directly or indirectly, by word, writing or circumstances whatsoever, but to execute all which shall be proposed, given in charge or discovered unto me by you, my ost reverend lord and bishop.

"All of which L _____, do swear by the lessed Trinity and blessed Sacrament which I am about to receive, to perform on my part to keep inviolably, and do call on all the Heavenly and Glorious Host of Heaven to witness my real intentions to keep this my oath.

"In testimony whereof I take this most oly and blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist, and witness the same further with my consecrated hand, in the presence of my holy bishop and all the priests who assist him in my ordination to the priesthood."

All of which L, do swear by the blessed trinity, and blessed sacrament which I am now to receive, to perform, and on my part to keep inviolably; and do call all the heavenly and glorious host of heaven to witness these, my real intentions, to keep this my oath.

In testimony hereof I take this most holy and blessed sacrament of the eucharist, and witness the same further, with my name written with the point of this dagger, dipped in my own blood, and seal in the face of this holy convent

To all of this I sincerely and conscien tiously swear with my eyes blinded, not knowing who to me administers this oath Oath of the Clan-na-Gael,




