set a political party, and does not control privileges granted to women of party lines, because it believes that all other. problems confronting our people will be especially death, and perpetual imprisonbound solid by a conscientious discharge of the duties of citizenship by every individual.

"While tolerant of all creeds, it holds that rubjection and support to any political power not controlled by American citizens, and which claims equal if not greater sovereignty than the government of the United States, is arreconcilable with American citizenship. We consider the non-sectarian free public school the bulwark of America, institutions, she best place for the education of American shildren. To keep them such, we protest against the employment of subjects of any un-American ecclesiastical power as officers er teachers of our public schools.

"We condemn the support out of the pub-He treasury by direct appropriation or by contract of any sectarian school, reformatory or other institution not owned and controlled by public authority.

"Believing that exemption from taxation is equivalent to a grant of public funds, we camand that no real or personal property be exempt from taxation, the title to which is not vested in the national or state governments, or in any of their sub-divisions.

"We protest against the enlistment in the United States army, navy, or the militia of any state, of any person not an actual citizen of the United States.

"We demand for the protection of our citisen laborers the prohibition of the importasion of pauper labor, and the restriction of all immigration to persons who cannot show beir ability and honest intention to become alf-supporting Ameri an citizens.

We demand the change of the naturalizasion laws by a repeal of the act authorizing she naturalization of minors, without a prerious declaration of intention, and by prowiding that no alien shall be naturalized or permitted to vote in any state in the union who cannot speak the language of the land. and who cannot prove seven years' consecugive residence in this country from the date of his declaration of his intention.

"We protest against the gross negligence and laxity with which the judiciary of our and administer the present naturalization laws, and against the practice of naturalizing allens at the expense of committees or sandidates as the most prolific source of the the basest uses

"We demand that all hospitals, asylums, seformatories, or other institutions in which people are under restraint, be at all times embject to public inspection, whe ther they are maintained by the public or b private perporations or individuals.

"We demand that all national ir state legislation affecting financial, comm. retal or industrial interests be general in ci sracter and in no instance in favor of any one see con of the country, or any one class of the

The pope can absolve from all oaths. Every bishop is ordinary judge in a cause of heresy. The reason is because the bishops can ex-officio, and ought to extirpate heretics, and inflict upon them the due punshments, and to this are bound on pain of deposition. Besides, are the inquisitors especially deputed by the apostolic see. Every bishop in his diocese is thought to be, and in reality is, a natural inquisitor, diterally born inquisitor), so as to have the same power with those already mentioned in a nause of heresy.

I will be faithful and obedient unto St. Peter, the holy apostolic Roman church, and our most holy lord, the pope of Rome, and his successors, canonically and lawfully elected: that I will give no advice, consent or assistance against the pontifical majesty and person; that I will never knowingly and advisedly, to their injury or disgrace, make public the councils entrusted to me by themselves, or by messengers or letters; also that I will give them any assistance in retaining, defending and recovering the Roman papacy and the regalia of Peter, with all my might and endeavor, so will allow it, and will defend them against and defend, with due form and honor, the legates and nuncios of the apostolic see, in the territories, churches, monasteries and other benefices committed to my keeping; and treat them with honor in their coming. abiding and returning, and that I will resist preserve, augment and advance the rights, honors, privileges, the authority of the Holy before mentioned successors, and that, at whatever time anything shall be decided to steps or measures have been taken in the matter. I will make it known to the same, our lord or his successors, or some other person by whose means it may be brought to their knowledge. That I will keep and carry out and cause others to keep and carry out the rules of the holy father, the decrees, ordinances, dispensations, reservations, provisions, apostolic mandates and constitutions of the Holy Father Sextus, of happy memory, as to visiting the thresholds of the apostles at certain prescribed times, according to the tenor of that which I have just read through. "I do denounce and disown any allegiance as due to any Protestant king, prince or date or obedience to any of their inferior officers. I do further declare the doctrine of the church of England, of the Calvinists, Huguenots and other Protestants, to be tampable and those to be damned who will

or forsake the same. "I do further declare that I will belp, assist and advise all or any of his hollness' agents n any place wherever I shall be, and to do my utmost to extirpate the Protestant docrine and to destroy all their pretended power, regal or otherwise. I do further promse and declare that, notwithstanding I may e permitted by dispensation to assume any eretical religion (Protestant denominations) or the propagation of the mother church's nterest, to keep secret and private all her agents' counsels as they entrust me, and not o divuige, directly or indirectly, by word, writing or circumstances whatsoever, but to like the swine our Lord Jesus Christ caused execute all which shall be proposed, given in harge or discovered unto me by you, my jost reverend lord and bishop.

"All of which I, ----, do swear by the dessed Trinity and blessed Sacrament which I am about to receive, to perform on my part to keep inviolably, and do call on all the Heavenly and Glorious Host of Heaven to witness my real intentions to keep this my oath.

"In testimony whereof I take this most holy and blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist, and witness the same further with my consecrated hand, in the presence of my holy bishop and all the priests who assist him in my ordination to the priesthood."

Iceland or America, or in any other kingdom or territory, I shall come to, and do my utmost to extirpate the heretical Protestant or Liberal doctrines, and to destroy all their pretended powers, legal or

I do furthermore promise and declare that I will, when opportunity presents, make and wage relentless war, secretly or openly, against all heretics. Protestants and Liberals as I am directed to do, to extirpate them from the face of the whole earth, and that pro posse persequar et oppugnabo."

I will spare neither age, sex or condition, and that I will hang, burn, waste, boil, flay, I will spare neither age, sex or condition, and taelr women and crush their infants' heads against the walls in order to annihilate their

Therefore, to the utmost of Irish. I take this obligation without any mental reservation, holding the same foreve binding upon me, and that any violation thereof, or desertion of my duty to the brotherhood is infamous, and merits the

everest punishment, so help me God." This oath the candidate is abjured to keep at the hazzard of his life. It was printed in the Chicago Inter Ocean and was sworn to be correct at the Cronin trial. 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
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
