Many people all over the country have been set to wondering over the remarkable performance of Miss Anna Eva Fay, the fair Mahatma, who will be at the Creighton Hall next week. She declares she uses only natural agencies to obtain the results, and this is Miss Fay's strong point, for it attracts strong characters, whereas the claim to occult powers attracts a different class. She is not superhuman, but a woman who possesses rare psychological powers.
