Dangerous Power of Catholics.

"One of the papers says: 'The Catholics are only about one-sixth of the population of the United States, yet they hold more than one-half of the public offices. Why is this? First, it is because they are instructed by the priests to get into office, and there to get appropriations from the public funds for the Catholic church. Then all Catholics are instructed to vote for the nominee, and they do it, for the priests see to it that their people go to the polls and cast their votes for their own men.""
