In 1473 and 1474 the summers were so hot the earth seemed on fire.

Any one can recall the hot summers of 1874, 1877 and 1890 and the drouth of 1894. The configuration of the heavens was more or less similar in all these years, showing conclusively that they influence the atmosphere and the earth, as the earth is making its revolutions around the sun.

Comets also affect the earth and its atmosphere. Elsewhere reference has been made to the stars acting as a balance and a guard to the earth as these swift messengers fly through space. The spectrum shows electricity to be one of the elements of a comet. The idea has been advanced that they furnish this fluid or agent to the systems which they visit. Such appears to be the case with the earth. As to the stars balancing the comets, in 1811, when the great comet of that year made its appearance, the planets Neptune, Uranus and Saturn were in one sign of the zodiac. In 1843, Jupiter, Saturn and Neptune were in one sign. In 1861, when the earth passed through the comet's tail, Jupiter and Saturn were in the same sign. In 1882, when Grull's enormous comet appeared, Jupiter, Saturn and Neptune were in one sign. In 1899 and 1900, we will have the phenomenon of Ven us, Mars, Saturn and Uranus in one sign and Jupiter very close by. If the parallel holds good, the inference is that a large comet will appear in our system within the next twelve months.

The return of the comet of 1835 is predicted for 1911. Jupiter and Saturn having such a powerful influence on comets, for this reason its return may be hastened or retarded. In 1811, when the comet was visible, the temperature was very high. The harvest was bountiful. The vintage was abundant. The grapes were of such excellent flavor the wine was called "the comet wine," and sold at high prices.

In the spring of 1843, a writer says: "The world was startled by the appearance of an object in the western heavens soon after sunset, like a streak of aurora, streaming from the region of the sun. Its outline was so distinct and its light so conspicuous as immediately to arrest the attention of persons abroad upon the roads and at sea. It proved to be a comet of the very largest class." Lieutenant Maury, describing it, says: "Soon after we had rounded the officer of the watch... the appearance of it in the west. The phenomenon was sublime and awful. The needle was greatly agitated, and a strongly edged pencil of light was coming up from the path of the sun in an oblique direction to the southward and eastward. Stars could be seen twinkling

through it, and no doubt was at first entertained but that this was the tail of the comet." A letter from Constantinople says: "The chief astrologer declares that it prognosticates great disasters; it forebodes divers calamities to the Greeks, and the French in Algiers. The Greeks read in its luminous tail the restoration of the Greek empire and the downfall of modern rule in Europe. The Persians consider it the flaming death-bladed sword of Ali uplifted to wreak vengeance upon the heretic followers of Omer, for their outrages upon the sainted tombs of Kerbehah."

The possibility of colliding with a comet is one to 281,000,000 times. If we did, it could not hurt the surface of the earth, but the gases mingling with the atmosphere might destroy it and depeopulate the globe. That time is not at hand. The dinner letter makes it his business to visit the fine houses and take the fishes intended for dinner. He suggests improvements, and shows the best new ways of preparing dishes. That the business is a profitable one may be judged from the fact that the wealthy class in London is to be seen in some cases as far as women are concerned they are very nervous and never lack for attentions. Among the latter, however, are some who do not relish the idea of being brought into personal contact with "uncle." It is for the special benefit of these that the publisher's great idea. She goes several times a day to the pawnbroker with articles belonging to the beautiful ones, for whom she gets the highest prices procurable in the items peddled. WOMEN EMPLOYED BARRIED.

A Chicago Street Railway was the latest to discriminate against women employees. The Metropolitan West Side Elevated Railroad company is the latest corporation to discriminate against women employees. The woman now employed as ticket sellers will not be discharged so long as efficient, as the report goes, but men only will be appointed to fill vacancies as they occur. Since the recent action of the Chicago and North-western Railroad company in discriminating against women employees was made public it is claimed there has been a tendency among other large corporations to follow in the same line. The principal reason advanced by the Northwestern company for its change of policy was that women were unsuited for promotion to the higher railroad positions, and that its civil service policy could be carried out successfully only with exclusively male employees. The Union Loop and Lake Street "L" companies some time ago discarded women ticket sellers for the good of the service. It is said the ticket offices of the Northwestern "L" road, now nearing completion, will be filled exclusively with men. As the company is the largest employer of labor of any of the "L" roads, its ban on female labor is creating more agitation in labor circles that any discriminating order of recent date.

Kissing a Civilized Custom. Among the aboriginal tribes of America and Central Africa kissing was unknown, though from the most remote times it has been familiar to Europeans and Asiatics. The Latins made three distinctions in kissing—the osculum being the kiss of friendship and respect, the basium that of ceremony, and the suaviolium that of love. The Semitic races used to kiss, and we find that the "kiss of peace" formed a part of the sacred rites of the early Christians, as it does of the Greek church at the present day. The Mongolian kiss differs from ours, and the lips of the kissers do not come into contact with one another. In kissing a person it brings the nose into light contact with the hand, cheek or forehead; the breath is drawn in through the nostrils, and the sex terminates with a slight smacking of the lips. The Chinese regard our mode of kissing as quite horrible, while we are so well satisfied with it that we have no desire to take lessons in the art from them.
