Chleage and Norway.

CHICAGO, May 27 .- The Wergeland, the first steamship to make the trip from Norway to Chicago, arrived in port at noon. Thousands gathered along the docks to welcome the foreign craft, and three steamers laden with enthusiastic Norweigans met the boat twelve miles out and accompanied her to the city.
