But why St. Denis is to have a supporter is not stated. What Columbus will be called when added to the saintly catalogue is not announced. There is already a St. Christopher, so that a new title will apparently have to be chosen. I take the liberty to suggest "Saint Idolatrous."



> general has no authority to issue such an order except when told to do so by the governor, and not by himself, he could not order it removed, but requested as a personal favor that the two officers allow their commands to remain.

Both officers complied with General Wheeler's request as a favor to himself, but the men were not so liberal, and many smothered exclamations of disgust were heard among them.

"I wish we had a few hundred rounds of ammunition, that we might fill the thing full of holes," said a well-known sergeant. Another, later in the day, suggested that it be taken by force and burned, and immediately found a following of two or three hundred men from the commands all over the state, but the flag had been concealed.

Aside from the excitement the event caused yesterday there is an after effect that is liable to be far more serious to the guard. An officer of one of the city regiments, in speaking of the affair, said: "It is an insult to the Illinois National Guard, and every officer and man in the service outside of the regiment which perpetrated the resents it as such. Speaking for my own regiment, I can say that there are ten or fifteen of our officers who will never be compelled to participate in an affair of this kind again, for we shall resign within the next two weeks. Of course we recognize the motive as a political one. Altgeld is doing all he can to catch the Irish support for United States senator, and this is only one of his many ways in which he has used the national guard to aid his political schemes."
