

GRANTED A NEW TRIAL.

Priest Connally, Convicted of Criminal Assault, Obtains Another Hearing.
By PAUL, Minn., June 15.—Judge Mitchell, of the supreme court, this morning handed down a decision reversing that of the lower court and orders that a new trial be granted Father James E. Connally, who is now serving a twenty years sentence in the state prison for criminal assault alleged to have been committed upon the person of Miss Mary Hanon, at Tower, Minn. The county attorney, a member of Connally's church, refused to prosecute the case and Connally was afterwards cleared, but the friends of the girl secured a change of venue to Duluth and there the priest was finally convicted last December. Judge Mitchell's decision has caused considerable surprise and comment as it was generally considered at the time of the trial that the evidence upon which the priest was convicted and sentenced was conclusive.

Canonical Law Disregarded.

NEBRASKA CITY, Neb., June 15.—In the Bishop Bonacum-Priest Corbett litigation Thursday the deposition of Dr. Phelan, of St. Louis, an eminent Catholic church authority on canonical law, indicated that the bishop had disregarded, in the treatment of the priests of his diocese all the cardinal principles of canonical law. Bishop Bonacum testified, giving a list of authors of ecclesiastical law that were not regarded as authority by the church of Rome, and the defense at once produced letters from the bishop in which he had recommended many of the books prescribed to the priests.
